

Ordinance No. NC-1 4 4, S-90

ORDINANCE

PROVIDING FOR THE REVISION AND UPDATING OF THE NUMBERING SYSTEM FOR ALL DWELLING UNITS, RESIDENTIAL HOUSES, HOTELS, APARTMENTS, INSTITUTIONAL EDIFICES, BUSINESS, MERCANTILE AND INDUSTRIAL BUILDINGS AND OTHER PERMANENT STRUCTURES IN QUEZON CITY; AUTHORIZING THE USE OF UNIFORM HOUSE NUMBER PLATES; AND APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNT OF SIX MILLION PESOS (P6,000,000.00) TO COVER THE COST THEREOF.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City in session assembled:

SECTION 1. The Office of the City Engineer shall, upon the effectivity of this Ordinance, undertake to revise and update the house numbering system in Quezon City, in accordance with existing rules and regulations affecting the same numbering system for all dwelling units, residential houses, hotels, apartments, institutional edifices, business, mercantile and industrial buildings and other permanent structures in Quezon City as enumerated, classified and defined under Section 701 of the National Building Code.

SECTION 2. The revised and updated house number of each of the structures mentioned in Section One hereof shall be inscribed in a uniform HOUSE NUMBER PLATES with the Official Logo of the City Government, together with the name of the Sub-City and street name.

SECTION 3. The House Number plate shall have the following specification:

- a) Kind of Material - high impact scratch-proof, three (3) color plastic plate. Vinyl paint to be used for letters, number and logo.
- b) Size - 4½" x 10" of 1.5 mm. thickness
- c) Type of Processing - screen processing with Quezon City Logo and Sub-City and street names.

SECTION 4. For purposes of appropriation and funding requirements for the House Number Plates, its cost, which shall include the proper installation thereof, shall not exceed Thirty Pesos (P30.00) per plate, to be borne by the City Government.

SECTION 5. There is hereby appropriated from any available funds in the City Treasury the amount of Six Million Pesos (P6,000,000.00), or so much thereof as may be necessary, to cover the cost of the house numbering system provided for in this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
