ORDINANCE NO. SP- 1679, S-2006
(PO2005-241, PR2005-166)

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE ACT OF BUYING, SELLING AND/OR PAWNING SECONDHAND CELLULAR PHONES WITHOUT THE ACCOMPANYING ORIGINAL RECEIPT OF THE ORIGINAL PURCHASE OF THE UNIT AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREOF.

WHEREAS, it is a universal concern of the private sector, particularly the business and industry sectors, that the issue of national economic recovery is one of the major determinant of the amount of new investments and in achieving a progressive and vibrant business environment;

WHEREAS, given the impressive track record of the City government, in coordination with the local law enforcement agency like the Quezon City Police Office in addressing the incidence of criminalities in Quezon City, the business sectors believe that the incidence of criminalities in the City can be addressed by further intensifying its crime prevention measures;

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WHEREAS, the proliferation and unregulated buying, selling and/or pawning of secondhand cellular phones have cause sharp increase in the crime of theft and/or robbery in the city;

WHEREAS, the occurrences of theft and/or robbery have become profitable on the part of the lawless elements due to the existence of ready buyers of the stolen cellular phones;

WHEREAS, the unregulated activities of buying and/or selling of secondhand cellular phones have also affected the viability of the legitimate distributors of cellular phones, and in some instances have caused the closure of said establishment;

WHEREAS, it is imperative for the government to create an environment conducive to the growth and development of all legitimate business industries.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. It is hereby unlawful for any person to purchase, sell and/or pawn any secondhand or used cellular phones without the accompanying original receipt of the original purchase issued in the name of the seller or possessor thereof.

SECTION 2. As used in this Ordinance, the following terms shall mean as follows:

- a. "Purchasing/Buying" shall refer to the transaction whereby one purchases used secondhand cellular phones founded on a valuable consideration.
 - b. "Selling" shall refer to the act of disposing by sale or transfer title or possession of property to another in exchange for valuable consideration, which includes but not limited to the following:
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- (i.) the display of cellular phones "FOR SALE";
- (ii.) the sale without the corresponding original receipt;
- (iii.) possession by the owner of the store and/or business establishment where the cellular phones are intended to be sold and shall include selling on consignment basis.

SECTION 3. The seller of the secondhand cellular phone shall have, in the absence of original receipt, the box of the cellular phone that bears the same serial number of the cellular phone and/other certificate of original purchase from the manufacturer or may substitute the original receipt required hereof in the absence thereof to produce and/or present an Affidavit of Loss, stating among other things, the name of the original owner/seller/distributor and the serial number of the cellular phone and shall submit the same to the subsequent buyer/new owner.

SECTION 4. Any person found violating the provisions of this Ordinance shall be penalized as follows:

First Offense - confiscation of secondhand cellular phones plus a fine of Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) or imprisonment of three (3) days but not more than five (5) days or both at the discretion of the court.


Second Offense - confiscation of secondhand cellular phones plus a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) or imprisonment of three (3) days but not more than five (5) days and cancellation or non-renewal of Business permit.

In case the violator is a corporation, the officers and employees responsible or who had participated in the act or omission shall be held liable therefore.


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SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days following the completion of its publication in a newspaper of general circulation.





AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. SP-9279, S-1972, SO AS TO CREATE THE QUEZON CITY SISTER-CITY COMMITTEE AND TO DEFINE THE POWERS AND FUNCTIONS THEREOF.

Introduced by Councilors ELIZABETH A. DELARMENTE, ROMMEL A. ABESAMIS, WINSTON "WINNIE" T. CASTELO, ERIC Z. MEDINA, EDCEL B. LAGMAN, ANTONIO E. INTON, JR. and RESTITUTO B. MALANGEN

WHEREAS, the City Council has already approved Ordinance No. SP-9279, S-1972, on May 23, 1972, creating the Quezon City Sister-Cities Commission and empowering the same to promulgate its policies, procedures, rules, regulations and measures in the performance of its functions;

WHEREAS, there exists a Sister-City or Town-Twinning program of the Bureau of Local Government Supervision under the Department of Interior and Local Government which empowers local authorities to establish sisterhood relationship with its counterpart within the country or abroad;

WHEREAS, DILG Memorandum Circular No. 97-306, provides the guidelines for the establishment of the Sister-City or Town-Twinning relationship;

WHEREAS, the said partnership aims to foster understanding, friendship and goodwill among different communities, and likewise, establishing technical exchange and cooperation in the areas of trade and investments, information technology, health, agriculture, human development, sustainable tourism and environmental management;

WHEREAS, there is a need to amend the said Ordinance in order to make it conform with existing issuances for effective implementation;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

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SECTION 1. Ordinance No. SP-9257, S-1972, is hereby amended, to read as follows:


"Section 1. SHORT TITLE. – This Ordinance shall be known as "The "QUEZON CITY SISTER-CITY COMMITTEE ORDINANCE".

Section 2. CREATION – There is hereby created the Quezon City Sister-City Committee, which shall be composed of the following:

- a. The City Mayor or his designated representative
- b. Chairman, Committee on Cultural Affairs and Tourism
- c. A representative of the Quezon City Tourism Council
- d. Cultural Tourism Affairs Office (CTAO) head
- e. City Planning and Development Officer
- f. Public Affairs and Information Services Office (PAISO) head
- g. The City Budget Officer


Section 3. OBJECTIVES – The Quezon City Sister-City Committee shall have the following objectives:

1. To develop and encourage greater friendly relations and better understanding between the people of the sister-cities through the exchange of:
 - a. Culture;
 - b. Technology;
 - c. Education;
 - d. Arts and Sciences;
 - e. Studies of government area development agencies;
 - f. Studies of government and private organization, its forms, functions, financing and operations;
 - g. Studies in commercial, industrial and agricultural fields;
 - h. Informations covering areas of government administration, community development and others not mentioned above;



2. Establish relationship that would afford mutual benefits to both sister-cities.
3. Assist in advancing the cause of world understanding and linking efforts in common humanitarian projects.
4. Secure the interest and enthusiasm of the citizenry in Quezon City to support this project as they may be also the beneficiaries in common humanitarian projects with the sister cities.
5. Coordinate and cooperate with other activities and service communities of International Civic, Trade, Professional and Cultural and Scientific organizations located in Quezon City regarding international relations with their counterparts abroad.





Section 4. FUNCTIONS OF THE COMMITTEE –
The Quezon City Sister-City Committee shall exercise the following powers and functions:

1. The Committee shall initially discuss among themselves the affiliation requirement and may define the characteristics of the local authority to affiliate with based on historical, socio-political-cultural and economic interests.
 2. The Committee shall formulate a brief profile, in a brochure form of the City.
 3. The Committee upon completion of the initial administrative requirements of affiliation shall recommend through the City Mayor, to the City Council, the Sister-City proposal for legislative approval and support.
 4. The Committee after the legislative approval shall prepare the following documents as part of the correspondence signify interest to establish partnership:
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- a. Local Government Profile
 - b. Sanggunian Resolution Endorsing the Affiliation initiative
 - c. Draft Memorandum of Understanding, highlighting the proposed fields of partnership.
 - d. List of Community Groups supporting the Sister City Partnership.
5. The Committee shall facilitate the holding of signing ceremonies of Memorandum of Understanding between partners.
 6. The Committee shall formulate and implement programs, projects and activities in furtherance of the intent of the Memorandum of Understanding.
 7. The Committee shall periodically inform the City Mayor, City Council and concerned community groups of the accomplishments of the Quezon City Sister-City Committee.
 8. The Committee shall exercise such other functions necessary and proper to carry out its mandate.


Section 5. MEETINGS - The Committee shall conduct regular meetings as scheduled by the Chairman of the Quezon City Sister-City Committee."


SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.




