Ordinance No. NC-109, S - 89

ORDINANCE

REGULATING THE USE OF QUIRING HIGHWAY FROM BARANGAY BALONBATO THRU BARANGAY ST. MONICA UP TO BARANGAY PASONG PUTIK, REGALADO AVENUE COMMON/EALTH AVENUE, AND TANDANG SORA AVENUE, QUEZON CITY AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, traffic congestion in Quezon City, particularly along Quirino Highway, has reached alarming and critical proportions brought about by numerous vehicles utilizing the said thoroughfare;

WHEREAS, Quirino Highway, a main thoroughfare to and from Novaliches area is generally a two (2) lane road traversed by thousands of vehicles everyday;

WHEREAS, easing traffic congestion is a priority program of this City;

NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City in session assembled:

SECTION 1. From 6:00 A.M. to 9:00 A.M. and from 4:00 P.M. to 8:00 P.M., everyday except Sundays and Holidays, no cargo truck shall be allowed to travel or pass along Quirno Highway from Barangay Balonbato thru Barangay Sta. Monica up to Barangay Pasong Putik, Regalado Avenue, Commonwealth Avenue and Tandang Sora Avenue, Quezon City.

SECTION 2. The term "cargo truck" as used in this Ordinance shall be understood to mean motor vehicle principally intended for carrying cargo and having license plates of the following classification: "S", "T", "TC", "TH", "TRLB", "TRHB", "HHB", "HLB" and "TRJ", and to include other vehicles such as lorries, vans, tankers, or other delivery vehicles, whether loaded or empty, having a gross capacity weight of more than 4,000 kilos.

SECTION 3. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall be punished by a fine of TWO HUNDRED PESOS (\$\mathbb{P}200.00).

SECTION 4. All fines imposed under this Ordinance, if uncontested, shall be paid to the Quezon City Treasurer. Fines in both contested and uncontested cases shall accrue to the Quezon City Government to be used exclusively for its traffic management and control activities.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation in Quezon City.
