ORDINANCE Numbered 7

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL FILM PRODUCERS TO PAY A REGULATORY FEE OF TWO HUNDRED (P200.00) PESOS FOR EVERY FILM, THE SHOOTING OF WHICH, IN PART OR IN WHOLE, IS DONE WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL LIMIT OF QUEZON CITY.

Be it ordained by the Council of Quezon City that:

SECTION 1. All film producers shall pay a regulatory fee of two hundred (P200.00) pesos for every film the shooting of which, in part or in whole, is done within the jurisdictional limit of Quezon City.

SEC. 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation, promoter or producer of films to make shootings within the jurisdictional limit of Quezon City without first obtaining a permit from the Mayor, and without paying first the fees prescribed in Section 1 thereof.

SEC. 3. Any violation of this Ordinance shall be punished with a fine of not less than P100.00 nor more than P200.00 or by imprisonment of not less than one month nor more than two months, or both, in the discretion of the Court. If the violation is committed by a firm, corporation or a juridical person, the manager, the managing director or the person charged with the management of the business of such firm, corporation or juridical person shall be criminally responsible therefor.

SEC. 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.

ORDINANCE NUMBERED 7, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE No. 57  
AND ORDINANCE No. 80, CURRENT SERIES.

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL FILM PRODUCERS TO PAY A REGULATORY FEE OF TWO HUNDRED (P200.00) PESOS FOR EVERY FILM, THE SHOOTING OF WHICH, IN PART OR IN WHOLE, IS DONE WITHIN THE JURISDICTIONAL LIMIT OF QUEZON CITY.

Be it ordained by the City Council of Quezon City, that:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 57, current series, amending Section 1 of Ordinance No. 7, series of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 1 - The following schedule of fee is hereby fixed and prescribed for the shooting of films within the jurisdictional limits of Quezon City:

For the first day of shooting - - - - - P 20.00  
For each successive day of shooting - - - 10.00  
Or for the shooting of the whole film - - 200.00

PROVIDED, That when the production or shooting is done inside the studio, the fee to be paid shall be fifty pesos (P50.00) for each film produced".

SEC. 2. Section 2 of Ordinance No. 57, current series, amending Section 2 of Ordinance No. 7, series of 1947, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

"SEC. 2 - It shall be unlawful for any person, corporation, promoter or producer of films to make shooting within the jurisdictional limit of Quezon City without first obtaining a permit from the Mayor subject to the payment of the fees prescribed in Section 1 hereof.

"No permit shall be granted until application therefor shall have been made to the Mayor stating the time, day and duration and the points within the city where the shooting shall take place, and whether the filming shall be staged, partly or wholly in Quezon City, so that the police could take precautionary measure for the convenience of the filming troupe.

"It shall be the duty of the person, corporation, promoter or producer of films to make within the first ten (10) days of every month a true and complete report of the number of shooting days and the number of films produced by them in their studio in the preceding month and to pay to the City Treasurer the fees due thereon.

"In case of willful neglect to file the report within the period prescribed herein, there shall be added to the fee a surcharge of 25% after the lapse of two months, and an additional surcharge of 25% should they fail to file the report thereafter, provided, however, that said surcharge shall be collected at the same time and in the same manner and as part
