AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. SP-2283, SERIES OF 2014, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CONDUCT OF A COMPREHENSIVE ASSESSMENT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN QUEZON CITY".

WHEREAS, Section 1, Article XIV of the 1987 Constitution provides that the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. SP-2283, S-2014, otherwise known as the "Quezon City Public Schools Comprehensive Assessment Ordinance", mandates the assessment of the quality of public schools in the City, specifically on the teaching mechanisms, provision of school facilities and instructional materials, and the achievement level of students;

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WHEREAS, there is also a need to evaluate the effectiveness of various interventions, such as the Alternative Learning System (ALS), Madrasah Education Program, Alternative Delivery Modes, reading comprehension strategies and feeding programs which are implemented in public schools;

WHEREAS, to continuously improve the projects and programs implemented in our public schools, there is a need to expand the scope of assessment, thereby amending the Quezon City Public Schools Comprehensive Assessment Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to Section 6 of Ordinance No. SP-2283, S-2014, to read as follows:

“d) Evaluation of Projects and Programs – including, but not limited to, the Alternative Learning System (ALS), Madrasah Education Program, Alternative Delivery Modes, Reading Comprehension Strategies and Feeding Programs.”

SECTION 2. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – If, for any reason, any part, section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remaining parts or provisions not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect.


SECTION 3. REPEALING CLAUSE – All ordinances, resolutions, executive orders, rules, regulations, and other administrative issuances, or the provisions thereof, which are contrary to or inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

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
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SECTION 4. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE – This Ordinance shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in any newspaper of general circulation.




