ORDINANCE NO. SP- 2721, S-2018

AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING THE INSTALLATION OF MOTION SENSOR ALARMS, IN ADDITION TO THE EXISTING ALARM SYSTEM IN THE VAULTS OF ALL PAWNSHOPS IN QUEZON CITY, PURSUANT TO BANGKO SENTRAL NG PILIPINAS CIRCULAR NO. 91, SERIES OF 1995, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, the Local Government Code of 1991 expressly grants the Sangguniang Panlungsod the power to enact and approve ordinances meant to prevent and suppress lawlessness, disorder and violence and impose penalties;

WHEREAS, there has been a rise in the number of cases of break-in robberies where in the vaults of banks as well as pawnshops were perforated by drilling a hole underground to gain access and empty its contents;

WHEREAS, the installation of motion sensor alarms will enhance the security and safety of the valuables stored in the vaults.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE – “An Ordinance Requiring The Installation of Motion Sensor Alarm In Addition to The Existing Alarm Systems, In The Vaults Of All Pawnshops In Quezon City, Pursuant To Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas Circular No. 91, Series Of 1995, and Providing Penalties For Violations Thereof.”

SECTION 2. COVERAGE – Pursuant to the said BSP Circular, this Ordinance shall be enforceable to all pawnshops, located in this City, being depositaries of valuable items.

SECTION 3. IMPLEMENTATION – Upon the approval of this Ordinance, the Business Permits and Licensing Office (BPLO) shall notify all pawnshops in this City of such requirement for the purpose of renewing business permits/license.

SECTION 4. PENALTIES – A fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00) shall be imposed for non-compliance of this Ordinance as well as the cancellation or revocation of the business permit of the pawnshop/s.


SECTION 5. REPEALING CLAUSE – All ordinances, resolutions, local executive orders, rules and regulations, or any part thereof inconsistent herewith are deemed repealed, modified or amended accordingly.

SECTION 6. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – In case any provision of this Ordinance is declared unconstitutional or invalid, the other provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall remain in full force and effect. *λ*



SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.




