ORDINANCE NO. SP- **2736**, S-2018

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING THE PROPERTIES FORFEITED IN FAVOR OF THE QUEZON CITY GOVERNMENT (QCG) THROUGH AN AUCTION SALE IDENTIFIED AS LOTS 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, BLOCK 7 AND LOT 28, BLOCK 7, ALL OF PCS-04-000208, COVERED BY TRANSFER CERTIFICATES OF TITLE (TCT) NUMBER 258066, 258067, 258068, 258069, 258070, 258071 AND 258093, RESPECTIVELY, PREVIOUSLY OWNED BY ROYAL MONARCH REAL ESTATE CORPORATION, CONTAINING A GROSS AREA OF MORE OR LESS THREE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED ELEVEN (3,811) SQUARE METERS, LOCATED IN BARANGAY KALIGAYAHAN, QUEZON CITY FOR THE BENEFIT OF THE CITY'S QUALIFIED INFORMAL SETTLER FAMILIES (ISFs).

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government (LGU-QC), through its Task Force on Socialized Housing and Development of Blighted Areas (TF Housing), in its desire to provide greater opportunities to significant number of Quezon City informal settlers/residents to own an in-city affordable decent housing and become formal residents of the City, has been relentless in its socialized housing projects; x

WHEREAS, several properties were forfeited by the Quezon City Government through auction sale, due to non-payment of real property taxes and absence of interested bidder, which forfeited properties remained unutilized, thus, its economic values have not been realized, plus the fact that majority of them remained blighted and undeveloped;

WHEREAS, based on the research, site inspection and validation conducted by the TF Housing, seven (7) of said forfeited properties are adjoining parcels of land located in Greenfield Subdivision, Barangay Kaligayahan, Quezon City, identified as Lots 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, Block 7 and Lot 28, Block 7, all of Pcs-04-000208, covered by Transfer Certificates of Title (TCT) Number 258066, 258067, 258068, 258069, 258070, 258071, and 258093, respectively, previously owned by Royal Monarch Real Estate Corporation, containing a gross area of more or less 3,811 square meters;

WHEREAS, the above-cited parcels of land was found suitable and feasible for socialized housing development;

WHEREAS, there is a need for the City Council to declare the use of the subject properties as a socialized housing site for the benefit of the City's qualified informal settler families (ISFs).

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. The subject property is hereby declared as a Socialized Housing Site.

SECTION 2. The TF Housing, subject to pertinent laws is hereby mandated to implement a socialized housing project on the subject properties for the benefit of the qualified ISFs of the City.

SECTION 3. The Housing, Community Development and Resettlement Department (HCDRD) is hereby task to undertake social preparation selection and pre-qualification of beneficiaries of the project, as well as processing of loan documents of the beneficiaries. A



SECTION 4. The Legal Department of Quezon City, in coordination and cooperation of other line agencies and Task Force of the City, is hereby mandated to immediately undertake necessary courses of action to transfer the title of the subject properties under the name of the Quezon City Government.


SECTION 5. All concerned local government agencies shall be provided with a copy of this Ordinance upon its approval.

SECTION 6. The Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.




