6th QCinema movie lineup places gender equality on the forefront

QUEZON City Vice Mayor Joy Belmonte is supporting the promotion of gender equality in the sixth year of the QCinema International Film Festival.

To celebrate 100 years of Philippine cinema, the city's film festival will have gen-
