ORDINANCE NO. SP- 2754, S-2018

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING AND INCREASING FROM ONE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED PESOS (PHP1,500.00) TO TWO THOUSAND PESOS (PHP2,000.00) THE QUARTERLY RICE ALLOWANCE OF NATIONAL PAID TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING PERSONNEL OF THE SCHOOLS DIVISION OFFICE IN QUEZON CITY BEGINNING THE FIRST QUARTER OF THE YEAR 2019, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. SP-2312, S-2014, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.

WHEREAS, the 1987 Philippine Constitution recognizes the importance of education in the achievement of national growth as it assigns the highest budgetary priority and ensure that teaching will attract and retain its rightful share of the best available talents through adequate remuneration and other means of job satisfaction and fulfillment;

WHEREAS, Section 17 of Republic Act No. 7160, otherwise known as the Local Government Code of 1991, authorizes the Local Government Units to provide adequate support to efficient and effective provision of basic services such as education;

WHEREAS, in 2014, in appreciation of the valuable role of our teaching and non-teaching personnel, the City Government approved through Ordinance No. SP-2312, S-2014 the grant of quarterly rice allowance in the amount of P1,500;

WHEREAS, this Ordinance aims to increase the rice allowance to P2,000 as assistance and in recognition of the contribution of our public school personnel as they nurture the future leaders of our country.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. All provisions, except for Sections 2 and 5 of Ordinance No. SP-2312, S-2014, shall be retained.

SECTION 2. Section 2 of Ordinance No. SP-2312, S-2014 is hereby amended to be read as:

"Section 2. ENTITLEMENT – The amount of Two Thousand Pesos (Php2,000.00) is hereby appropriated to defray the Rice Subsidy Allowance for each national paid Teaching and Non-Teaching Staff."

SECTION 3. Section 5 of Ordinance No. SP-2312, S-2014 is hereby amended to be read as:

"Section 5. COMPENSATION - The funds necessary for the implementation of this Ordinance shall be included in the 2019 Annual Budget of the Quezon City Government and onwards from any available funds."

SECTION 4. REPEALING CLAUSE – All Ordinances, Executive Orders and Administrative Regulations or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed and/or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5. SEPARABILITY CLAUSE – If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, other parts or provision hereof which are not affected shall continue to remain in full force and effect. *✓*





SECTION 6. EFFECTIVITY – Upon its approval this Ordinance shall take effect beginning the first quarter of the Year 2019.




