Mayor Bautista assures QC residents infra projects are worthy

'THIS is where your taxes go.'

In a speech during the inauguration of several infrastructure projects on June 5, Quezon City Mayor Herbert Bautista assured the residents of Quezon City that their taxes are working for them and the city's finances are being put into good use.

Among the infrastructure projects that were inaugurated is the city's first government-owned crematorium inside the 200-square meter Baesa cemetery in Quirino Avenue, District 6.

He advised the residents to take good care of the city's projects.

According to City Civil Registry head Salvador Cariño, the crematorium will prioritize indigent and minimum wage

earners. The fees to be collected for the use of the facility are still subject for discussion in the city council.

He added that there are also plans

to build a columbarium inside the Baesa Cemetery compound.

Bautista also formally opened Bistekville 15 and a multi-purpose hall in Barangay Sauyo, school building, covered courts and several road and drainage improvements in various *barangay* (villages).
