

QC receives 300 e-trikes from Energy department

TO further promote environmental protection and preservation in the city, Mayor Herbert Bautista led the acceptance of 300 electronic tricycles from the Department of Energy (DoE) on June 24.

DoE Director III Atty. Cesar Dela Fuente III and QC Department of Public Order and Safety (DPOS) head Ret. Gen. Elmo San Diego also attended the turnover ceremony.

The E-trike Project is part of DOE's program to promote energy efficiency and clean technologies in the transport sector.

Thirty e-trikes will be distributed to barangays, while 270 will be given to Tricycle Operators and Drivers Associations (TODA).

San Diego said that the goal is to eventually replace the 25,000 tricycles in the city with e-trikes.

The E-trike Project is part of DoE's program to promote energy efficiency and clean technologies in the transport sector.

Each e-trike costs 450,000 pesos, can fit five passengers and run up to 40 kilometers when charged for three to four hours.
