ORDINANCE Numbered 29.

ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE HANGING OR DISPLAYING OF CLOTHES OR OTHER UNMIGHTLY OBJECTS TO PUBLIC VIEW.

It is ordained by the City Council of Quezon City,

SECTION 1. Prohibition. - It shall be unlawful for any person to hang, display, or expose to public view, in any window or other place fronting a public place, any clothes or other objects which are offensive to the public.

SECTION 2. Penalty for violation. - Any person found guilty of a violation of this Ordinance shall be punished with a fine of not more than two hundred pesos, or by imprisonment for not more than six months, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court. If no person could be found responsible for such violation, then the clothes or objects so hung, displayed or exposed to public view shall be confiscated, forfeited, and shall be treated and disposed of as property used in the commission of an offense.

SECTION 3. Effectivity. - This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage.
