

QC to open public veterinary clinic

The pet clinic will offer services, such as spay and neuter, deworming and ear cleaning

A public veterinary clinic that will offer residents affordable services for their pets will be opened soon by the local government of Quezon City.

City Ordinance 2854-2019, introduced by then councilor Anthony Peter Crisologo, was approved by former Mayor Herbert M. Bautista.

“Low-income pet owners of Quezon City should have access to affordable veterinary services, where pets can receive veterinary consultation, treatments, vaccinations, grooming, medicines, and animal supplies,” the ordinance reads.

The City Veterinary Department will supervise the clinic.

A free anti-rabies vaccination for pets will be offered for free.

Services, such as spay and neuter castration, deworming, and ear clearing, will also be available at affordable prices.

Through the ordinance, a Veterinary Clinic committee will also be formed to draft the implementing rules and regulations for the proper enactment of the local law. The committee will be composed of representatives of the City Administrator, City Veterinary Department, City General Services Department, City Engineering Department, City Health Department, City Budget Department, and City Treasurer’s Office.

The budget to be appropriated for the veterinary clinic and the site where it will be put up will also be determined by the Veterinary Clinic committee.
