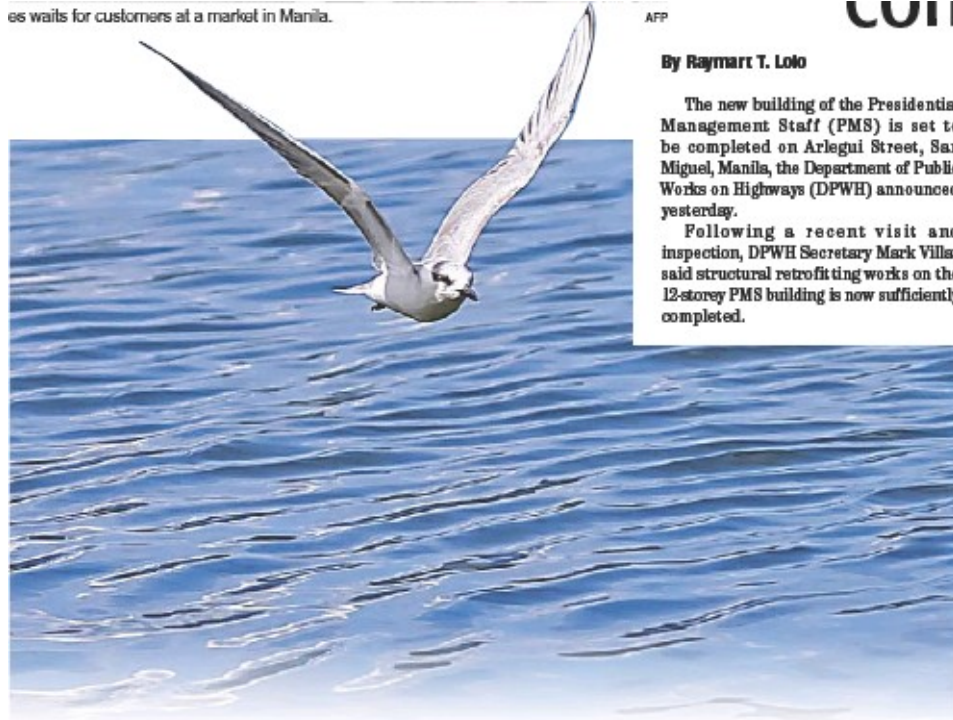


Covered walkway connects to MRT-7 station

The new building of the Presidential Management Staff (PMS) is set to be completed on Arlegui Street, San Miguel, Manila, the Department of Public Works on Highways (DPWH) announced yesterday.

Following a recent visit and inspection, DPWH Secretary Mark Villar said structural retrofitting works on the 12-storey PMS building is now sufficiently completed.

A mixed-use building combines three or more structures such as residential, retail, transportation terminal, or parking into one building.

City Resolution 7874-2019, introduced by former Councilor Marvin Rillo of the previous Council, urges the construction of a covered walkway linking the MRT-7 station in Fairview that is currently being built to a 33-storey commercial and residential building that is also going up in the area.

The resolution says the cost for proposed walkway should be shouldered by the building developer, RYS-Sons Holdings and Development Corporation.

“The linking or connecting of the said MRT-7 station to the said mixed-use building will not entail any cost to the government since it is the RYS-Sons Holdings and Development Corporation, which will undertake the necessary construction and will shoulder the needed expenses,” the resolution explains.
