Quezon City to lead Chinese New Year festivities

A fireworks display, followed by a grand concert of the Climax Band and singer Rico Blanco will cap the celebration.

Expected guests are Quezon City Association of Filipino Chinese Businessmen Inc. President Joseph Lim Bon Huan and QC Chinatown Development Foundation Chairman Charles Chen.
