QC vax booking either online or by barangay

The Quezon City (QC) local government is launching the third mode of its vaccination program against the coronavirus that will be made available to the public this week. Under this mode, residents will be required to key in their details via a government-as-

sisted online registration and scheduling system, which is now on its final testing stages. In a statement, QC officials explained there continues to be a limited and sporadic supply of vaccines, which made them seek other ways of scheduling residents for their shots. This will either be via EZconsult online booking or by barangay-assisted booking.

The QC local government earlier issued an ultimatum on EZconsult to upgrade its server capacity to address issues raised before the firm last Friday, 18 June.

EZconsult has already advised the city that it has successfully addressed the issues plaguing its system.

However, it explained it can only assess these improvements after another round of online booking.

The QC government assured residents it will not stop implementing measures to ensure smooth and efficient access to Covid-19 vaccines.

QC officials said, "We continue to ask our QCitizens for patience and understanding even as we introduce different modes to register or book, due to the dependence of the local government on vaccines allocated by the national government at the moment."

They added, "Once we have a sufficient and steady supply of vaccines, we will be able to reach out to more QCitizens whether they register online or via assisted booking."
