

More QC housing projects inaugurated

Several priority housing projects initiated by the local government of Quezon City were launched by Mayor Joy Belmonte on Wednesday.

These include a three-storey

Socialized Housing Project and a 12-story development in Barangay Balingasa. She joined the QC Housing and Community development and Resettlement department head Ramon Asprer, Chairman Teresa Montalbo, Coun. TJ Calalay, former QC

Vax to Normal co-chairman Joseph Juico, and former councilor Ollie Belmonte.

“We have studied the replanning to make the original three-story building a 12-story, so that more families can be benefited,” Asprer said.

Mayor Belmonte assured residents that the city government aims to provide decent and affordable housing for its citizens.

“I hope you can bequeath the house to your children, because in the future the value of your properties, which you bought at a cheap price, will be great. That is our commitment to the people of Quezon, affordable housing.”

“For me, everyone should be given the opportunity to have decent and affordable housing and live right here in QC,” she added.

The Socialized Housing Project 32 will benefit around 363 families. Presently, the city has targeted “Katiyakan sa Paninirahan” to about 17,000 indigent families.

Meanwhile, the isolation facility will lessen the need for the city to use public schools as quarantine facilities helping the services closer to its residents, the city recently opened an Action Center in the fourth district.

The newly-built district 4 Action Center, some departments in QC Hall will have satellite offices such as the office of Senior Citizens Affairs, Persons with disability Affairs office, QC Health department, Social Services development department, Public, Employment Services office, QC Youth development office, City Civil Registry department, and office of the Action officer. A pharmacy is also included inside the action center to provide accessible and affordable essential medicines.
