AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. SP-2958, S-2020, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING INDIVIDUAL QUARANTINE PROTOCOLS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC", AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. SP-3034, S-2021.

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2020, the City Council enacted Ordinance No. SP-2958, S-2020, entitled "An Ordinance Establishing Individual Quarantine Protocols During The COVID-19 Pandemic", this Ordinance was subsequently amended by Ordinance No. SP-3034, S-2021;

WHEREAS, the latter amendatory ordinance requires facility-based quarantine for COVID-19 cases;

WHEREAS, on December 31, 2021, the Inter-Agency Task Force (IATF) adopted Resolution No. 155 placing the National Capital Region on Alert Level 3 status in view of the rising active cases of COVID-19 in the Philippines, possibly due to the Omicron variant of the COVID-19 virus;

WHEREAS, the new Omicron variant of COVID-19 is reportedly extremely transmissible, but has milder symptoms. Due to the possible massive surge in the number of mild COVID-19 cases caused by Omicron variant, strictly requiring facility quarantine in every instance may no longer be practical. Hence, further amendment of Ordinance No. SP-2958, S-2020 is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. - Section 5 of Ordinance No. SP-2958, S-2020, as amended by Ordinance No. SP-3034, S-2021, is hereby further amended to read as follows:

“SECTION 5. PLACE OF QUARANTINE AND ISOLATION. - The QCHD shall require the person required to undergo quarantine or isolation at home, or at the available Quezon City HOPE quarantine and isolation facility or other authorized quarantine and isolation facility, as may be determined by the QCHD in accordance with the prevailing health standards.

Home Quarantine may be allowed when appropriate while under monitoring of the QCHD, provided that the home has a room and toilet for the exclusive use of the concerned person. Notwithstanding other provisions under this Ordinance, the length and conditions of the home quarantine shall be subject to QCHD guidelines in accordance with applicable protocols of the Department of Health, the Inter-Agency Task Force, and other relevant agencies.”
