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*WHEREAS, on 17 August 2022, the Office of the City Mayor issued Executive Order No. 21, Series of 2022 reconstituting the Quezon City Legislative Executive Development Advisory Council (LEDAC) and its Executive-Legislative Agenda (ELA) - Capacity Development (CAPDEV) Agenda Management Team;*

*WHEREAS, on 19 August 2022, the LEDAC officially convened to ensure that plans and policies of the City are effectively carried out;*

*WHEREAS, LEDAC is an advisory and consultative body tasked to determine and recommend socio-economic development goals and policies that would serve as a guide in the formulation and implementation of the City Development Plan ensuring that there is a convergence of the legislative and executive agenda towards a common vision for the city;*

*WHEREAS, the body is tasked to formulate the Executive-Legislative Agenda which contains the thrusts and priorities of both the executive and legislative departments to address the pressing concerns and new developments in the City;*

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<b>IV. Infrastructure, Urban Planning and Development</b>	1. Review and amend Ordinance No. SP-1917, S-2009 or the Quezon City Green Building Ordinance and promote the installation of Solar Power Energy in Barangay Halls and other City Government Buildings;
	2. Ordinance for the creation of training facilities per district that will be used as venues for training seminars with our partner private companies and NGOs; and
	3. Ordinance creating mental health centers per district that will be equipped to handle the specific mental health concerns of the district.
<b>V. Institutional Development</b>	1. Ordinance setting guidelines for public consultations in barangays; and
	2. Amend and review Ordinance No. SP-1942, S-2009 or the Participation, Accountability and Transparency Ordinance (PAT Ordinance).

RESOLVED FURTHER, that the Legislative Agenda of the 22<sup>nd</sup> City Council is consistent with the policy thrusts of the National Government and the City Government.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Office of the City Mayor and the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG), Quezon City Field Office.

<b>I. Human and Social Services A. Poverty Reduction and Social Development</b>	1. Ordinance that will fund our city hospitals to establish and sustain "Pharmacy/Health on Wheels";
	2. Ordinance creating a hotline specifically for mental health issues and that may also serve as a tele-consulting forum;
	3. Ordinance that will make education become more accessible to our working students, out-of-school youth and persons deprived of liberty;
	4. Ordinance that will create educational seminars for the following topics: a. health and sanitation to our communities; b. financial literacy to students and young adults; c. environmental protection; and d. urban gardening.

Ordinance for an “Inter-Barangay Sports Competition” for all kinds of sports; and</p> <p>5. Ordinance creating a position for Sports Coaches/Coordinators in every barangay that will be tasked to create sports program and introduce sports science in the community.</p>

Ordinance celebrating the best practices of local businesses, including the awarding of “Best Private Employer in Quezon City” and “Best Workplace in Quezon City”;</p> <p>2. Ordinance recognizing our enterprising constituents and create an award for the “Top Ten Upcoming Local Entrepreneurs of Quezon City”;</p> <p>3. Ordinance promoting Quezon City products by institutionalizing the “Made in QC” Program of our city;</p> <p>4. Review and amend Ordinance No. SP-2219, S-2013, or an Ordinance Adopting the Economic Development Incentives Code of Quezon City and update its provisions to further support micro, small, and medium businesses and barangay-based livelihood programs; and</p> <p>5. Ordinance strengthening PESO and ensuring proper matching of skilled employable workers to available job opportunities in Quezon City.</p>
<p><b>III. Environmental and Climate Change</b></p>	<p>1. Ordinance creating edible gardens in barangays and subdivisions, including the establishment of nurseries;</p> <p>2. Ordinance that will give newly married couples “Urban Gardening Starter Kits” that will include seedlings of edible and nutritious plants, garden tools and implements, and free seminars for urban gardening, composting and making your own organic fertilizer;</p> <p>3. Ordinance that encourages and promotes green procurement in our local businesses; and</p> <p>4. Ordinance designating “Car-free/Emission-free Roads” for specific hours or day of the week.</p>

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
