ORDINANCE NO. SP- **3142**, S-2022

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE REVISED OFFICIAL SEAL OF QUEZON CITY.

WHEREAS, the Quezon City was created by Commonwealth Act No. 502 on October 12, 1939 and became the Capital of the Philippines on July 17, 1948 when President Elpidio Quirino signed Republic Act No. 333;

WHEREAS, in 1974, the Office of the President approved the official seal of Quezon City which bore the text "Punong Bayan ng Pilipinas" at the bottom of the border, Quezon City being the capital of the Philippines then;

WHEREAS, on May 7, 1976, then President Ferdinand E. Marcos signed into law Presidential Decree No. 940 that restored Manila as the Capital of the Philippines and consequently led to the changing of the text "Punong Bayan ng Pilipinas" to a shorter word "Pilipinas";

The text "LUNGSOD", "QUEZON" and "PILIPINAS" are inscribed at the border of the triangle."

SECTION 2. The following shall be the symbolism for the elements of the seal:

- a. The Quezon Memorial Shrine - the iconic symbol of Quezon City with three pylons representing Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao.*
- b. The 3 Stars/Mullets - represent the vision of its founder, President Manuel Luis Quezon, the dedication of its past, present and future leaders and the hard work of its people. All responsible in building this great city.*
- c. The Gavel - represents the city's respect to Philippine constitution and other laws of the land.*
- d. The Lamp of Knowledge - symbolizes the city's pursuit of excellence through intellectual illumination.*
- e. The Color Scheme - is patterned after the colors of the Philippine Flag as follows:*

The blue color shall bear Cable No. 80173; the white color, Cable No. 80001; the red color, Cable No. 80108; and the golden yellow, Cable No. 80068 pursuant to Republic Act No. 8491.

When Pantone is used, the blue color shall be 286C, the red color shall be 193C and the golden yellow color shall be 122C.

When RGB is used, the blue color shall be 0-56-168, the red color shall be 206-17-38, the white color shall be 255-255-255 and the golden yellow color shall be 252-209-22.

When CMYK is used, the blue color shall be C99-M80-Y0-K0, the red color shall be C12-M100-Y87-K3, the white color shall be C0-M0-Y0-K0 and the golden yellow color shall be C2-M17-Y91-K0.

When HEX is used, the blue color shall be #0038A8, the red color shall be #CE1126, the white color shall be #FFFFFF and the golden yellow color shall be #FCD116.

- f. The Font Type - the font type to be used shall be Europa Grotesk SB Med.*
