WHEREAS, Republic Act No. 9994, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizen Act, provides to "(4) establish community-based health and rehabilitation programs for senior citizens in every political unit of society";

WHEREAS, Dementia is the loss of cognitive functioning - thinking, remembering, and reasoning - to such an extent that it interferes with a person's daily life and activities. This condition, prevalent in our senior citizens remains a cause of family irritants, misunderstanding, discrimination and mental and physical violence;

WHEREAS, in an article of HINDAWI on Behavioral Neurology reports it states that "according to World Alzheimer report the world regional distribution of new dementia cases was 4.9 million, 49% in Asia, 25% in Europe and 1.7% million in the Americas and there may be a 63% increase by 2030";

RESOLVED FURTHER, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the respective offices of the Members of the House of Representatives (1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> District), Office of the City Mayor, Office of the Vice Mayor, Offices of City Councilors (1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> District), City Health Department and All Barangays of Quezon City.
