ORDINANCE NO. SP- 3223, S-2023

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 8 OF ORDINANCE NO. SP-3041, S-2021, ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE QUEZON CITY REGISTRY SYSTEM, THEREBY PRESCRIBING THE UNIFIED QUEZON CITY IDENTIFICATION CARDS TO BE ISSUED TO ALL RESIDENTS OF QUEZON CITY AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES FOR THE ISSUANCE THEREOF"

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED: 

SECTION 1. "Section 8. PENAL PROVISIONS" of Ordinance No. SP-3041, S-2021 is hereby amended and shall be read as follows:

"1. Any person who utilizes the QC ID to commit any fraudulent act or for other unlawful purpose/s shall be punished with imprisonment for a maximum of one (1) year and a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00); 



2. *The willful submission of or causing to be submitted a fictitious name or false information in the application, renewal, or updating of the QC ID by any person shall be punished with imprisonment for a maximum of one (1) year and a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00);*
3. *The unauthorized printing, preparation, or issuance of the QC ID by any person shall be punished with imprisonment for a maximum of one (1) year and a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00);*
4. *Any person who shall willfully use or disclose data or information in violation of Section 3 of this Ordinance shall be punished with imprisonment for a maximum period of one (1) year and a fine of Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00); and*
5. *Any person in any establishment/office, whether private or public, who will not honor the QC ID as one of the valid identification cards shall be punished with a fine as follows:*

*First Offense – One Thousand Pesos (Php1,000.00)
 Second Offense – Two Thousand Pesos (Php2,000.00)
 Third Offense – Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00)
 Succeeding Offense/s – Five Thousand Pesos (Php5,000.00)”*

SECTION 2. “Section 9. IMPLEMENTING RULES AND REGULATIONS” of Ordinance No. SP-3041, S-2021 is hereby amended and shall be read as follows:

“SECTION 9. REPLACEMENT OF QUEZON CITY ID

A. Replacement Fee –

1. *In case of lost, damage, theft or any circumstance that the applicant intends to amend his/her information as displayed on his/her QC ID card, the applicant may apply for the replacement of his/her QC ID card at the designated offices issuing QC ID card.*
2. *A replacement fee in the amount of One Hundred Pesos (Php100.00) shall be paid by the applicant.*
3. *The applicant must submit an Affidavit of Loss stating the circumstances why he/she is applying for the replacement of his/her QC ID card and shall surrender his/her QC ID card, unless the same is lost or cannot be found.*

B. Exception to pay replacement fee –

1. *An indigent applicant may be exempted from paying the required replacement fee, provided that he/ she must present a Certificate of Indigency either from Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) or the barangay where he/ she resides.*
2. *In case, there is/are error/s displayed on his/her QC ID card and such error/s is/are not attributable to the applicant, the City shall waive the payment of replacement fee.*

3. The City Mayor may through an Executive Order or a similar issuance, waive the replacement fees for those residents of a specific area or barangay that has been affected by a disaster that caused great destruction of property, including the loss of the QC ID.”

SECTION 3. The numerical successions from Sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13 and 14 of Ordinance No. SP-3041, S-2021 shall be adjusted accordingly.

SECTION 4. REPEALING CLAUSE. – All local ordinances, rules and regulations or part thereof that are inconsistent with the provision of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 5. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. – This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
