

## Health care, community center greet homeowners in QC's biggest district

Sen. Bong Go and Quezon City Councilor Mikey Belmonte unveiled on Friday new projects for the city's most populous district with the inauguration of the MB-SBG Multi-Purpose Building and the MWell Medical Para sa Barangay project in Barangay Batasan Hills.



Providing funding support for the initiatives, which Belmonte spearheaded in collaboration with the private sector, Go commended the city government for its efforts to improve the delivery of public service in the community.

The multi-purpose building that was inaugurated is one of several structures being constructed in Quezon City that will serve as a venue for activities focused on community-level barangay disaster risk reduction, environmental management and strengthening community-based organizations. "This building is more than just bricks and mortar; it is a symbol of your commitment to each other and to the future of your community. It will be a place where you can gather to share ideas, conduct events, celebrate your achievements and support each other in times of need," Go said. "Given the magnitude of the population in District 2 barangays and the communities' expressed need for accessible infrastructure, this multi-purpose building can now be used for the delivery of government services as well as strengthen community organizations, as we partner with them in improving the quality of life in the city," Belmonte said.

MWell, the digital healthcare arm of Metro Pacific Investments Corp., also reached out to Belmonte for the launch of its Medical para sa Barangay projects in three locations in District 2. Medical services that may be sought in MWell's satellite booth include eye cataract screening; teleconsultations; mobile laboratories with facilities for electrocardiography, urinalysis and x-ray; and house-to-house consultation for bedridden patients, seniors and expecting mothers.
