WHEREAS, the 2024 Asia Youth Basketball Championship took place at Chungju Gymnasium in South Korea, from February 16 to 18, 2024;

WHEREAS, Korea Basketball Association and Chungju Basketball Association were the organizers of the 2024 Asia Youth Basketball Championship. This event was participated by the following Asian countries: Korea, China, Japan, the Philippines, Taiwan, Singapore, Hongkong and Thailand;

WHEREAS, the CityHoops Basketball Philippines, founded in 2015, serves as a platform that will demonstrate the skills of aspiring basketball players and assist them in honing their character as they can be potential leaders of our Nation. The CityHoops Basketball Philippines is divided into different age brackets, one of which is the U11 Team;

WHEREAS, over the years, the CityHoops Basketball Philippines has produced several basketball players for both Collegiate and National Teams in this Country;

WHEREAS, the CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team is among the Philippine Teams which participated in the 2024 Asia Youth Basketball Championship, and is composed of talented players from different schools in this country, namely: Kyrie Race, Simon Padilla, and Sancho Sison from La Salle Greenhills, Karl Gandioco, Manolo Pasion, Pierce Ibuyan, and Xian Latay from Ateneo de Manila University, Massey David from Xavier Nuvali, Clyne Magpantay from FEU Diliman, and Hubert Bautista from Lourdes Novaliches;

WHEREAS, the sponsors for the players of CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team are Café Aurora PH, Philippine Long Distance Telecommunications, SeaBird International Resort Boracay, Anta Kids, and KISS Sports Apparel;

WHEREAS, CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team bagged the silver medal, placing 2<sup>nd</sup> place out of 16 teams, finishing with 5 wins and 1 loss;

WHEREAS, the CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team is the only Filipino Team to enter the finals since the other teams from the Philippines suffered defeat in their respective age groups;

WHEREAS, the success of the CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team must also be attributed to its coaches, namely, Pau Ycasiano and Homer Bautista, for shaping the team's performance and outcomes;

WHEREAS, in the future, CityHoops Basketball Philippines will be the exclusive partner of the Asia Youth Basketball League, as the former aims to send more players to South Korea in this annual event;

WHEREAS, it is fitting and proper for the City Government to profoundly recognize and commend the unparalleled dedication, unwavering perseverance, and exceptional teamwork of the CityHoops Basketball Philippines U11 Team that represented the Philippines in the 2024 Asia Youth Basketball Championship and brought glory to our Country.
