ORDINANCE NO. SP- 3249 , S-2023

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. SP-1452, S-2004 AND PRESCRIBING THE RENTAL RATES FOR THE USE OF AMORANTO SPORTS COMPLEX AND ITS FACILITIES, AND PROVIDING GUIDELINES THEREFOR

WHEREAS, Section 13, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states that the "State recognizes the vital role of the youth in nation-building and shall promote and protect their physical, moral, spiritual, intellectual, and social wellbeing. It shall inculcate in the youth patriotism and nationalism, and encourage their involvement in public and civic affairs";

WHEREAS, Section 15, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states that "The State shall protect and promote the right to health of the people and instill health consciousness among them";

WHEREAS, Section 17, Article II of the 1987 Philippine Constitution states that "The State shall give priority to education, science and technology, arts, culture, and sports to foster patriotism and nationalism, accelerate social progress, and promote total human liberation and development";

WHEREAS, Section 129 of the Local Government Code, states that "Each local government unit shall exercise its power to create its own sources of revenue and to levy taxes, fees, and charges subject to the provisions herein, consistent with the basic policy of local autonomy. Such taxes, fees, and charges shall accrue exclusively to the local government units";

WHEREAS, the City owns and operates the Amoranto Sports Complex located at Barangay Paligsahan, District IV, Quezon City with several facilities intended for public use;

WHEREAS, there are natural and juridical persons who intend to rent the facilities of Amoranto Sports Complex for personal wellness and training, and for other activities;

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. SP-1452, S-2004 also mentions the existing and past ordinances wherein rates have already been prescribed for existing facilities;

WHEREAS, new facilities inside the Amoranto Sports Complex have been and will be completed based on the approved masterplan for the complex, therefore requiring the prescription of new rates by the City Government;

WHEREAS, there is a need to determine the rental rates of the sports facilities in Amoranto Sports Complex.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. TITLE. – This Ordinance shall be known as "An Ordinance Prescribing the Rental Rates on the Use of Amoranto Sports Complex and its Facilities, and Providing Guidelines Therefor".

SECTION 2. FEES AND CHARGES. – There is hereby imposed the following rental rates for the use of the renovated and newly-built facilities of Amoranto Sports Complex, thus:

SECTION 3. RATES FOR EXISTING/OLD FACILITIES. — The rates prescribed for the use of the existing/old facilities under Ordinance No. SP-1452, S-2004 shall remain valid and effective.

SECTION 4. GENERAL PROVISIONS GOVERNING THE USE OF AMORANTO SPORTS COMPLEX AND ITS FACILITIES. – The use of Amoranto Sports Complex and its Facilities shall be in accordance with the following conditions:

- 4.1 A reservation fee equivalent to 50% of the total amount due for the use of each facility shall be charged; the amount of which is not subject to refund should the client cancel their reservation.
- 4.2 Cancellation/Rescheduling must be made 2 days before the scheduled reservation to avoid the forfeiture of the reservation fee. Due to force majeure or other foreseen events (bad weather), the affected reserved slot may be rescheduled.
- 4.3 Senior Citizens and persons with disability shall be entitled to a 20% discount on all charges for the use of the facilities of the Amoranto Sports Complex.
- 4.4 QC ID holders shall be entitled to a 20% discount on all charges for the use of the facilities of the Amoranto Sports Complex.

4.5 The City Government may prescribe other rules and regulations pertaining to the special use of the new facilities.

SECTION 5. ADJUSTMENT OF RENTAL RATES. – The City Government, through the Amoranto Sports Complex Administration Office, has the authority to adjust the rental rates if necessary, subject to the provisions of Executive Order No. 301, Series of 1987, Commission on Audit Circular No. 2019-005, and relevant laws.

SECTION 6. REPEALING CLAUSE. – All local ordinances, rules and regulations, or part thereof, that are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance, are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION 7. EFFECTIVITY CLAUSE. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
