## NO HINDRANCE TO LEARNING

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A blind student, assisted by her teacher, reads aloud from a book printed with braille alphabets during Thursday's launching of braille "storybooks" at the **Quezon City Public Library (QCPL)**. The books were developed by the National Library of the Philippines, in consultation with Resources for the Blind, and were published using the braille alphabet, named after its inventor, 19th-century French educator Louis Braille, who himself was blind. QCPL said it is the first among local government libraries to have braille books in its collection.
