ORDINANCE NO. SP-1191, S-1002

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING INCENTIVES TO ALL BARANGAYS UTILIZING THEIR OWN TRUCKS FOR SOLID WASTE COLLECTION SERVICE IN THEIR RESPECTIVE BARANGAYS.

WHEREAS, Section 17 (b) (1) (iii) of RA Nò. 7160, otherwise known as a Local Government Code of 1991 provides that all barangays shall provide basic services and facilities devolved to them which include, among others, general hygiene and sanitation, beautification and solid waste collection;

WHEREAS, in compliance with this provision, several barangays in Quezon City have acquired their own solid waste hauling trucks and have been actually providing solid waste collection services in their respective barangays;

WHEREAS, this service becomes an added expense on their part due to the maintenance cost such as fuel and oil, spare parts and services rendered by truck drivers and "paleros";

WHEREAS, there is a clamor among these barangays for an incentive package from the City government since their budgetary allocations for solid waste management services are insufficient;

WHEREAS, the City government, in its effort to encourage the barangays in their solid waste management operations, has designed an incentive package scheme;

WHEREAS, the incentive package scheme shall be awarded to participating barangays that comply with the terms and conditions cited herein.



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NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE. - This Ordinance shall be known and cited as "Incentives For Barangays Utilizing Own Trucks For Waste Collection".

SECTION 2. COVERAGE. - This incentive package applies to all barangays that meet all the criteria set forth in this Ordinance.

SECTION 3. CRITERIA FOR AVAILMENT. - For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following are the criteria for availment:

- a) The barangays shall be the registered owner of the solid waste collection truck;
- b) The area being collected of solid waste by the barangay truck must not be collected by the City's contracted hauling trucks;
- c) The collected solid wastes must be dumped at the Payatas dumpsite or any other mandated dumpsites by the City;
- d) All trips made by the barangay truck must be supported by trip tickets that are patterned after the Garbage Collection Trip Report Form (EPWMD Form 1) being utilized by the City;
- e) The barangay must keep a record of the solid waste collection service of their hauling truck.

SECTION 4. GUIDELINES IN COMPUTING PERCENTAGES OF THE INCENTIVE PACKAGE. - For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following are the guidelines in computing percentages of the incentive package:

- a) The barangay shall submit its monthly report of solid waste collection dispatch to the Environmental Protection and Waste Management Department (EPWMD). Trip tickets shall be attached as supporting documents of the monthly report;
- b) The EPWMD shall counter-check said report with Dispatch Reports of the City to ensure that no solid waste collection was made by the City-contracted hauling trucks in the areas serviced by the barangay truck;

- c) The barangay shall receive an incentive package equivalent to the amount corresponding to the number of trips made by the barangay truck. Provided, however, that the actual trips made by the truck does not exceed the estimated truck requirements.

SECTION 5. COMPUTATION OF INCENTIVE. - For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following is the computation of incentive:

$$\text{Incentive Amount} = (\text{Number of trips made by the barangay truck}) \times (\text{Amount/trip})$$

SECTION 6. BASIS IN THE COMPUTATION OF INCENTIVE PACKAGE.
- The basis for the computation is the study of the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) conducted in 1997-1998 preparatory to the formulation of the Master Plan of Metro Manila Solid Waste Management:

- a) Population
- b) Factors
 - 1. Waste Generation/capital/day = 0.585 kg. (based on JICA study)
 - 2. Assumed Density = 200 kg./ cu.m.
- c) Garbage Collection Truck Capacity
 - 1. 10 - wheeler = 16 cu.m.
 - 2. 6 - wheeler = 8 cu.m.
 - 3. Mini-DT/ Compactor = 8 cu.m.
- d) Actual Garbage Truck
 - 1. Number of cell/route/zone
 - 2. Collection day
 - 3. Frequency of Collection
 - 4. No. of trips/day
- e) Garbage Collection Cost
 - 1. Truck type/capacity
 - 2. Approved hauling rate based on district

SECTION 7. CONDITIONS OF THE INCENTIVE PACKAGE. - For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following are the conditions of the Incentive Package Scheme to qualify the barangays:

- a) The barangay shall accomplish properly the Barangay Garbage Collection Report Form;
- b) The barangay shall abide by the standard operating procedures on dispatching and collection system of EPWMD;
- c) Trips made must be exclusively for the use of the barangay based on agreed route/cell/zone by the barangay and the city through EPWMD.



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
SECTION 8. PAYMENT. - For the purpose of this Ordinance, the following are the ways of payment:

- a) The awarding of the incentives to the Barangays shall be made on a monthly basis during the enforcement of the incentive package.
- b) The disbursement of the incentives shall follow the budgeting, accounting and auditing procedures of the government.

SECTION 9. SOURCE OF THE INCENTIVE PACKAGE. - The allocation for the incentive package shall be taken from available funds of the City.


SECTION 10. EFFECTIVITY. - This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its approval.
