ORDINANCE NO. **1360**, S-2002

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A LIVELIHOOD TRAINING CENTER FOR EVERY DISTRICT IN QUEZON CITY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:


SECTION 1. A Livelihood Training Center is hereby mandated to be established for every district in Quezon City in any place/site owned by the City government to be determined by the City Mayor.




SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.


