ORDINANCE NO. SP-**1377**, S-2004

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 1 AND 5 OF CITY ORDINANCE NO. SP-1204, S-2003, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS AN ORDINANCE GRANTING BARANGAY LENGTH OF SERVICE BENEFITS/INCENTIVES TO ALL ELECTED OFFICIALS AFTER THEIR TENURE OF OFFICE AND PROVIDING NECESSARY CLARIFICATIONS THEREOF.

Introduced by Councilors VINCENT P. CRISOLOGO, ELIZABETH A. DELARMENTE, VICTOR V. FERRER, JR., ROMMEL R. ABESAMIS, ERIC Z. MEDINA, JORGE L. BANAL, JESUS MANUEL C. SUNTAY and JANET M. MALAYA.

WHEREAS, Section 1 of City Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003, provides that elected barangay officials after their tenure of office are entitled to a financial incentive of One Thousand Pesos (P1,000.00) per year of service;

WHEREAS, the amount provided in the said section of Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003 does not commensurate to the services rendered by barangay officials during their tenure of office;

WHEREAS, it is only proper and realistic that necessary adjustments be made to the incentive given to barangay officials to give due importance to the services rendered by them during their tenure of office,

WHEREAS, in order to facilitate the implementation of Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003, necessary clarifications are herein provided.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003 is hereby amended, to read as follows:

(Handwritten signatures and initials)

“SECTION 1. Elected officials after their tenure of office shall be entitled to a financial incentive of Two Thousand Pesos (P2,000.00) per year of service”.

SECTION 2. Section 5 of the said ordinance is likewise amended, to read as follows:

“SECTION 5. The sum of Ten Million Pesos (P10,000,000.00) is hereby appropriated and set aside for the purpose, funds to be taken from any available funds of the City government”.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of computing the financial incentive granted under Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003, as amended, the term/tenure of office mentioned in Section 1 hereof shall be reckoned from the 1989 Barangay Elections.

SECTION 4. In case of death of the beneficiary barangay officials, the rule on intestate succession provided under the Civil Code of the Philippines shall apply.

SECTION 5. Barangay officials who are entitled to avail the benefits/incentives provided under City Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003, are the following:

- a. Those barangay captains and barangay kagawads who have completed three consecutive terms.
- b. Those barangay kagawad who succeeds the Office of the Barangay Captain, in case of vacancy in the office of the latter.
- c. Those appointed barangay officials who have served for at least one (1) year after their tenure of office.
- d. Those barangay officials whose term/tenure of office were interrupted.


SECTION 6. All other provisions of City Ordinance No. SP-1204, S-2003, not specifically amended shall remain in force and effect.

SECTION 7. This Ordinance shall cover all qualified barangay officials elected after the date provided under Section 3 of this Ordinance and those who will be elected in the succeeding barangay elections.


SECTION 8. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.




