ORDINANCE NO. SP-398, S-96

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE AMOUNT OF FEES TO BE COLLECTED BY TRICYCLE OPERATORS AND DRIVERS ASSOCIATION FROM APPLICANTS WHO DESIRE TO BECOME MEMBERS OF ANY TRICYCLE OPERATORS AND DRIVERS ASSOCIATION (TODA).

WHEREAS, it is common knowledge that different Tricycle Operators and Drivers Operations (TODA) require varied amounts from each applicant to become members of their respective TODA's;

WHEREAS, these membership fees range from as low as One Thousand Five Hundred Pesos (P1,500.00) to as high as more than Ten Thousand Pesos (P10,000.00) ;

WHEREAS, as a result of these exorbitant fees being collected by the TODA's, the drivers are often left at the mercy of loan sharks just to make both ends meet;

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN SESSION ASSEMBLED:

SECTION 1. Coverage. All Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association within the territorial jurisdiction of Quezon City shall be covered by this Ordinance.

SECTION 2 Membership Fees. All Tricycle Operators and Drivers Association (TODA) thru its officers are allowed to charge membership fees not exceeding Three Thousand Pesos (P3,000.00) per applicant.

SECTION 3. Daily dues paid by its members shall not exceed the maximum amount of Five Pesos (P5.00) for each member per day.

SECTION 4. Sanctions. The officer or officers of any TODA who, in violation of the provisions of Section 2 of this Ordinance, shall collect from their prospective members any amount in excess of the prescribed ceiling for membership fees, shall be liable for a fine of not more than Five Thousand Pesos (P5,000.00) or an imprisonment of not more than six (6) months or both at the discretion of the court.

SECTION 5. Separability Clause. If, for any reason/s any part or provisions of this Ordinance shall be held unconstitutional or invalid, other parts or provisions hereof which are not affected thereby shall continue to be in full force and effect.

SECTION 6. Effectivity. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after approval and publication for at least once in a newspaper of general circulation.
