RESOLUTION NO. SP-10381, S-2026

A RESOLUTION STRONGLY URGING THE QUEZON CITY REAL ESTATE MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OFFICE (CREMCO) AND THE CITY ASSESSOR'S OFFICE TO CONDUCT A JOINT INVENTORY OF ALL IDLE LANDS IN QUEZON CITY, IN COORDINATION WITH THE BARANGAY CONCERNED, WHETHER PUBLICLY OR PRIVATELY-OWNED OR CITY GOVERNMENT'S FORECLOSED PROPERTY, WHICH ARE SUITABLE FOR URBAN AGRICULTURE

WHEREAS, CREMCO is an office created under Quezon City Ordinance No. SP-2872, S-2019; it is tasked to inventory all real properties owned by the Quezon City Government;

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WHEREAS, the City Assessor's Office is the one in-charge in the inventory of privately-owned and Quezon City Government's foreclosed property;

WHEREAS, while Quezon City is classified as highly-urbanized city and a center of commerce due to its fast-growing economic activities, still, there are areas therein that are not utilized or developed for its intended purpose;

WHEREAS, idle or vacant lots can be planted with growing food and other agricultural products that are essential to improve food security, create green spaces, and offer economic and social benefits to the City's constituency;

WHEREAS, urban agriculture, which includes cultivation, processing, and distribution of agricultural products (food or non-food) in urban areas, would help in bringing food production closer to consumers to improve food security, reduce food miles, and increase sustainability;

WHEREAS, in view of the rising cost of basic commodities and transported agricultural products, urban agriculture is a timely undertaking in every barangay as a measure of food security and an alternative method to reduce reliance on external food sources.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to strongly urge, as it does hereby strongly urge, the Quezon City Real Estate Management and Control Office (CREMCO) and the City Assessor's Office to conduct a joint inventory of all idle lands in Quezon City, in coordination with the barangay concerned, whether publicly or privately-owned or City Government's foreclosed property, which are suitable for urban agriculture.

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
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RESOLVED FURTHER, that a copy of this Resolution be furnished to CREMCO and the City Assessor's Office for their information and appropriate action.
