



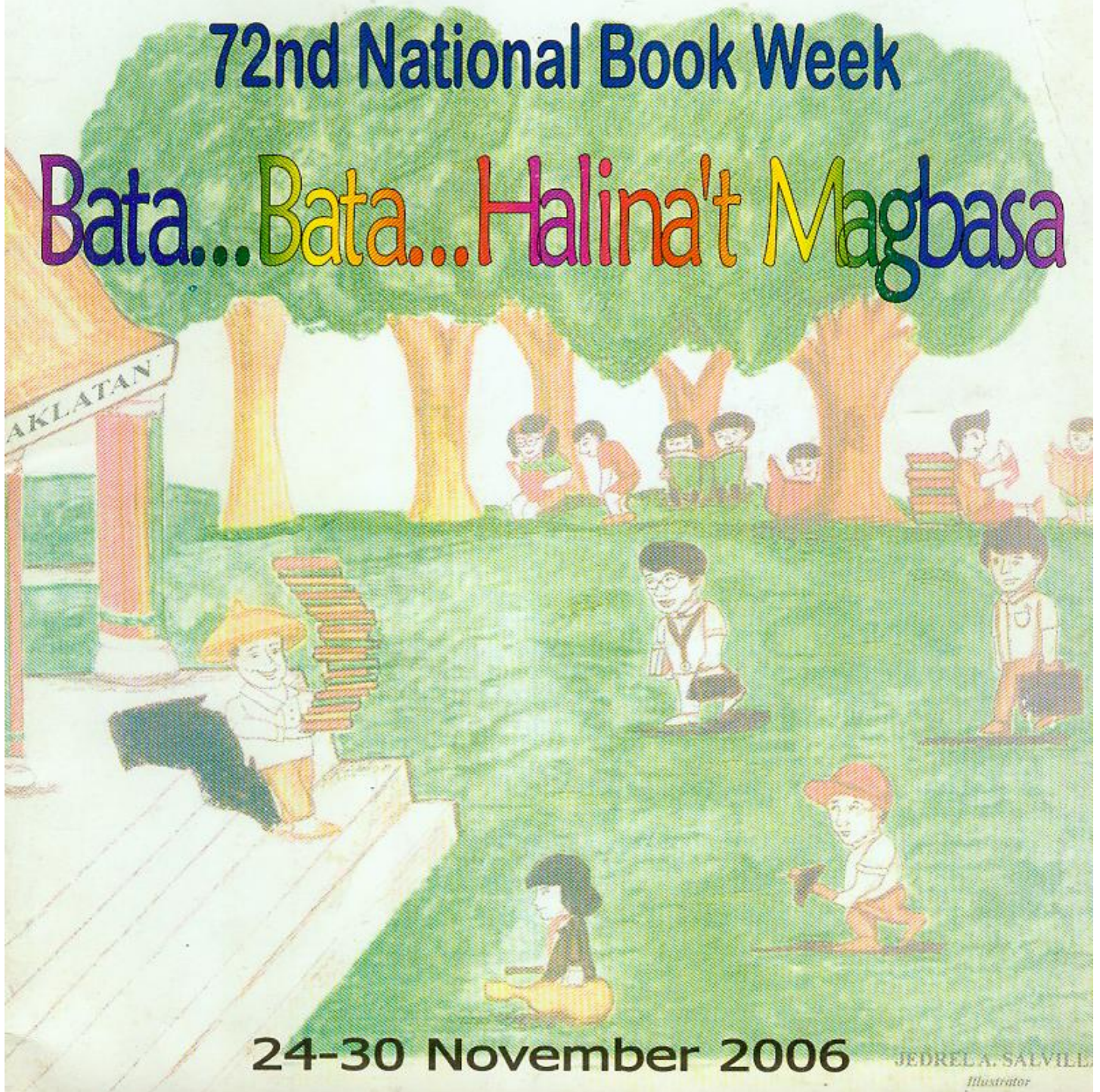

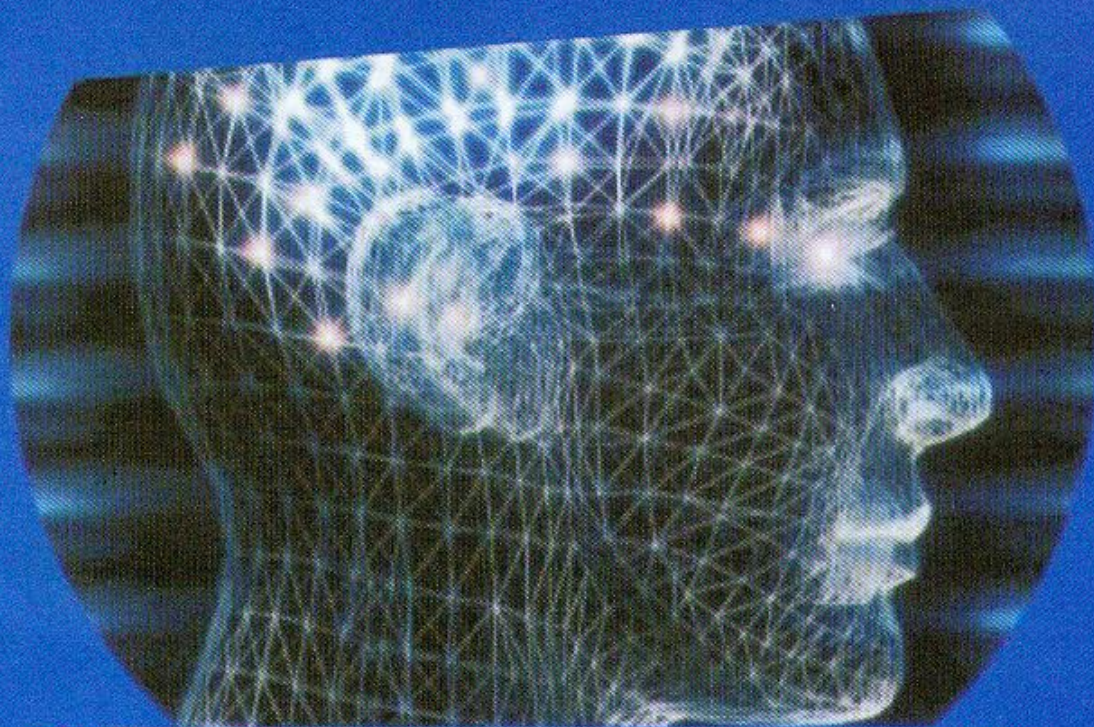

PROCLAMATION NO. 109

DESIGNATION THE PERIOD FROM NOVEMBER 24 TO 30 OF THE YEAR
AS NATIONAL B OOK WEEK
