HIGHLIGHTS OF ACHIEVEMENTS

(Following from the Ten Pillar Prescriptions of the Mayor)

1. **CIVIC ORDER AND SAFETY.** Citywide lighting that has brightened even the nooks and corners; enhanced incentive to the uniformed police and provision of mobile equipment for improved response capabilities; fielding of more traffic enforcers and assistance of Junior police. Improved coordination with national agencies of traffic control and regulations, now with Mayor and MMA Chairman as Traffic Czar. Clean up and closures of illegal and improper nightlife activities in City main avenues; drive against drug addiction and trafficking. Sustained drive against illegal sidewalk vending. The City Peace and Order Council already set up with operating units down to the barangays.
2. **EFFICIENT AND ADEQUATE PUBLIC SERVICE.** Improved infrastructures, construction of new roads and repairs of existing ones, opening of inter-neighborhood roads, declogging and improved drainage facilities, deepwells for communities, depressed area electrification implemented.

Clean and Green Program rid city of unhygienic and unsanitary garbage accumulation; smoke-belching campaign among most effective in Metro Manila.

SMILE PROGRAM viably acting as intervention program for livelihood, basic services and environmental improvement concerns.

3. **EDUCATIONAL, SOCIAL, AND HEALTH AND MEDICAL SERVICES.**

a. Top priority for human capital development, and primarily through education: about 40 school buildings during the last two years - of some 460 classrooms; teacher incentives; auxiliary teachers to fill up shortage; free in-service training for both elementary and high school teachers, benefitting no less 1,300 teachers; enhanced school board-financed for classroom, pupil and teacher needs, including school-based cultural and sports development. Continuing program with the University of the Philippines.

City scholarship and youth development program benefit no less than 2700 college students; and special cultural and educational program for street children;

Enhanced skills training benefitting close to 2,500 trainees in two years.

Launching of the Quezon City Polytechnic for technician manpower development.

Soon to be put up an Instructional and Learning Resource Center to benefit 90 elementary and 30 secondary schools with state of the art instructional technologies.

Expanded sports development program with barangay based sports and athletic activities and enhancement of program for competitive sports; and total renovation of Amoranto Sports Complex.

b. Expanded health services through the City's Department of Health, the biggest in Metro Manila LGU health department: implemented immunization programs in coordination with national government; primary health care program for control of communicable diseases; outreach programs with civic and professional organizations and through increased number of barangay health centers.

Improvement and enhancement of Quezon City General Hospital and establishment of two more district hospitals - in Novaliches and Payatas. Referral system to be operationalized with other government and private hospitals.

c. Expanded social services reaching out to the underprivileged youth, the elderly (with Senior Citizens program now in full operation), the handicapped, the street children and the urban poor and depressed communities. Expanded Yakap program for preschoolers and juvenile delinquents and offenders; improvement of prison conditions; enhancement of mortuary and burial assistance.

4. **IMPROVED PUBLIC ASSISTANCE SERVICES.** A mechanism is in place for quick response in times of calamities, particularly during typhoons and fires (a noticeable reduced incidence this year).

Disaster Coordinating Council already in place with mobilization capabilities down to the barangays.

Streamlining of public assistance services (including computerization) of constituency services - in civil registry matters, soon for business permits and licenses (in addition to simplification), real estate assessment and tax payments.

Public Assistance Center Office created for the purpose. Industrial Relations Office mounted four Job Fairs to date and succeeded in placements of over a thousand jobseekers; Livelihood training provided by both SMILE and Negosiyete Clubs.

5. **ECONOMICS AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT.** Passage of Local Revenue Code with strong pro-business features; Business Development Project to show case best of Quezon City and attract investors to city; development of business center sites; land use plan formulation; tax amnesty and other incentives to business; closer coordination with trade and industry associations; enhancement of services.
6. **CULTURAL, CIVIC AND ACADEMIC ENHANCEMENT.** As site of top universities, cultural and educational cooperation arrangements entered into with the UP, and soon with other Universities; tourism sites for development identified; in the works are plans for National Museum of Arts and Museum of Natural History. Enhanced development of Quezon Memorial Circle as venue for cultural and artistic performances and demonstrations.

The QC Bulwagan has become new venue for cultural academic and civic gatherings and presentation, but Convention facilities are planned to be put up.

7. **PROGRAM FOR THE URBAN POOR.** The City's basic services benefit significantly the large urban poor sector. On top of this, public assistance specifically for the sector have been more systematically organized with the reorganization of urban poor affairs office into a People's Bureau attending to the special needs of urban poor and squatters; more effective and viable re-location and resettlement programs now being implemented; improvement housing and shelter services better coordinated and implemented.
8. **THE YOUTH'S SPECIAL PLACE IN THE CITY.** About 65 per cent of the City's population are 25 and below. In addition to educational services in the City's public schools, the expanded sports program of the City essentially benefitting the youth, significant support and assistance being given to the Sanggunian Kabataan federation (training and public assistance services), programs for the street children, pre-schoolers; summer jobs for the youth; involvement in the City's programs by QC Scholarship Corp., the organization of the Blue Cap, and support to the Alliance of Student Councils; the Girl and Boy Scouts programs.
9. **IMPROVED FISCAL AND FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT.** The City's revenues, increasing by more than 43 per cent, have more than doubled during the last two years; credit facilities available through the government financial institutions to support massive infrastructure and basic services programs of the City; revenue enhancement measures in place with implementation of local revenue code and enhanced collection campaign. Aggressive business development to expand long-long term revenue base.
Institution of measures to improve administrative fiscal management. Support of private sector through Mayor's initiatives being gained.
10. **IMPROVED ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS.** Essential through effective leadership and viable management style of the Mayor and the support of the City Council, above accomplishments were possible.
Improvement in administrative systems - organizational structure and systems and procedures, make programs and projects implementation more effective and efficient. Streamlining and improved personnel productivity (helped by incentives, with the City now having among the highest personnel financial benefits), manifest better results on overall efficiency of administration.

THE IMPERATIVES TOWARD A MODEL CITY

TEN PILLARS OF MAYOR MATHAY'S ADMINISTRATION

First, WE SHALL HAVE A CITY WHERE CIVIC ORDER RULES with a traffic system that works, a police force that keeps the peace and deserves the respect of the citizenry, lawful and law abiding citizenry, where communities work in harmony with each other and with their governments, and where government itself enforces the law - justly and fairly.

Second, WE SHALL HAVE A CITY WHERE THERE IS EFFICIENT AND ADEQUATE PUBLIC SERVICE where the transport system is efficient and affordable, with the environment preserved and protected and sanitary, assured by programs to keep the city clean and healthful, with adequate supply of clean water, with adequate infrastructure facilities to protect, and shelter the citizens and facilitate work and productive activities, and institutions to train and educate, and facilities to treat the sick and the infirm.

Third, WE SHALL HAVE A CITY THAT PROVIDES AND SUSTAINS THE DELIVERY OF SOCIAL, MEDICAL AND EDUCATION SERVICES, particularly for the deserving sectors of the City's population. Specifically, there is need to have adequate classrooms, teachers, hospitals and clinics, medical supplies, and facilities. We need to provide for the undeserved groups improved nutrition, housing and shelter, and access to employment opportunities. We need to attend to the needs of the youth, the elderly, the infirmed and the handicapped, and in general the burgeoning urban poor while evolving workable measures for managing the squatting problem.

Fourth, WE SHALL HAVE A CITY THAT IMPLEMENTS A QUICK RESPONSE system for rendition of government and public assistance-for the injured, for the sick needing emergency help, for relief and rehabilitation during disasters and calamities, and for the victims of crime and violence. Further, we shall make it easy and convenient for ordinary citizens who will come to city hall for licenses, permits, civic and administrative assistance, and for common services to be provided by their city government.

Fifth, THE CITY GIVEN ITS STATE OF RELATIVE UNDERDEVELOPMENT COMPARED TO OTHERS IN METRO MANILA AND GIVEN ITS RESOURCES SHALL EXPLOIT ITS STILL UNLIMITED OPPORTUNITIES FOR ECONOMIC AND BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT. The City in the past developed into what was essentially a residential and civic institutional city. This is clearly not enough for a rapidly growing population, about 75 per cent of which are urban poor. Some business and economic development shall have to take place in the long run. The City must explore and implement entrepreneurial initiatives in commercial, industrial and service sectors. The opportunities are there given the vast and still relatively undeveloped land resources for commercial and industrial development. The north and the east triangles are examples. Such a development must be the basis of long term progress for Quezon City.

We will institute an efficient land use management system for the city and the complementary zoning systems for a much more orderly economic and business development minimizing if not totally avoiding altogether the urban blights that have befallen other urban centers of the country.

Sixth, OUR CITY IS ALREADY THE VENUE OF ACADEMIC, INTELLECTUAL AND CULTURAL CITADELS AND INSTITUTIONS GIVING OUR CITY THE enviable reputation. We shall keep it that way and much more as we enhance its cultural and educational development. We are capable of a quantum achievement in our cultural development-in the arts, in music, in architecture and design and even in ethnic folkarts. Concerts, art exhibits, flower gardens and shows, conventions and meetings shall be an increasing fare in our cultural and intellectual milieu. We will work for facilities for such cultural fares - a convention center no less to provide the venue for these activities.

Seventh, OUR CITY SHALL HAVE THE IDEAL SETTING AND ACCOMMODATION FOR A CONVIVIAL LIVING AND PRODUCTIVE LIFE AND WORK FOR ALL SOCIO-ECONOMIC SECTORS. Our City has the fastest growth rate compared to other Metro Manila cities, of urban poor and specifically of squatter population, which by the latest estimate now number about 55 percent of the city population. Perhaps, it is unwittingly the opportunities in the City that beckon such members of our population. Nevertheless, this sector of our population (the urban poor and squatters) need more focussed and specialized attention with respect to housing and shelter and certainly employment. We need some fasttrack programs to resolve this worsening situation.

Eight, THE YOUTH, THE HOPE OF THE FATHERLAND, SHALL HAVE A SPECIAL CONSIDERATION IN OUR CITY. The young deserves a special attention in the economic, social and cultural development of the City. Our population is a young population, about 65 per cent is below 24 years old. This is a dependent sector as unemployment is high and the potential for juvenile criminality and drug addiction is great given the high proportion of the urban poor among them. Social, economic and educational action programs need to be developed for them.

Ninth, FOR THE GOVERNANCE OF OUR CITY AND TO SUPPORT THE INITIATIVES IN ALL OF THE AREAS OF CONCERN ABOVE STATED THERE SHALL BE INSTITUTED IN CITY ADMINISTRATION an efficient and effective financial and budgetary management. Essentially, this includes the adoption of measures to expand the revenue base, and to accelerate growth in revenues. At the same time, expenditures need to be rationalized to assure that priority programs to meet our objectives are adequately funded. The potential for growth in revenues is still great, given the achievement of the above mentioned objectives.

And tenth, LIKEWISE THE CITY SHALL HAVE AN IMPROVED ADMINISTRATIVE MANAGEMENT TO ACHIEVE OUR MISSIONS AND DELIVER THE ESSENTIAL CITY GOVERNMENT SERVICES. The City government's organizational and administrative structures shall be streamlined and its administrative operating systems made more efficient the better for government to serve its constituents. The City administration has at the present time a bloated bureaucracy-slow and inefficient. Our interest in this respect is to upgrade the quality of both our rank and file and administrative staff-both in skills, competence and in the essential values and discipline.
