NOVADECI is a model cooperative organization so recognized by Land Bank of the Philippines, acknowledged as a 2005 Outstanding Multi-Purpose Cooperative by the Cooperative Development Authority (CDA), and accorded Hall of Fame status by the Quezon City Cooperative Congress.

Initially incorporated on September 3, 1976 as Novaliches Credit Cooperative, Inc. with 70 members and an initial capitalization of P7,000.00, NOVADECI now has 24,229 members with an authorized capitalization of P1 Billion. In the past, NOVADECI held office at the residences of its officers. Now, it has built two multi-storey buildings in the heart of Novaliches for their business transactions.

Opening its membership to non-market vendors in 1984, NOVADECI is now a profitable and financially stable organization working for the benefits of its thousands of members coming from 330 different barangays from Quezon City and Caloocan City as well. Its diversified services include health and medical service, mutual benefit services, savings products, loan products, consumer and marketing services and educational benefits. Given its current paid-up capital of P124.6M, NOVADECI has embarked on housing projects and micro-finance lending to Quezon City's Sikap Buhay.

Its entrepreneurial and financial success has enabled NOVADECI to provide community services, such as mass feeding, dental and medical services, sports activities, environmental improvement projects and other community-oriented works.

For all these and more, NOVADECI is Quezon City's Outstanding Organization for 2006.

Dr. Raquel Del Rosario-Fortun is a much awarded outstanding woman, well-known for her medical science (forensic pathology) and practice, for which she has been recognized by the Ten Outstanding Young Men (TOYM) Foundation and by the Outstanding Women in the Nation's Service (TOWNS). Recently, Metrobank recognized her as an Outstanding Teacher for 2006. She was Gintong Ina awardee in 1999, acknowledged as Pathologist of the Year by the Philippine Society of Pathologists (1996) and Outstanding UP Alumna for Medicine. For her sterling qualities, Dr. Fortun has received numerous awards and recognition.

But especially deserving of special merit are her works as a volunteer as forensic pathologist in identifying victims of disasters and calamities not only here in the Philippines but also in Cambodia, East Timor, Northern Mariana Islands, Sierra Leone, all through the United Nations agencies. Quezon City particularly recognizes her services as a volunteer forensic pathologist whose findings were crucial in identifying victims of the Ozone fire (1996) and Payatas landslide (2000) tragedies here in the city.

Puno obtained his Bachelor of Laws degree from the University of the Philippines where he was also given the opportunity to hone his skills in writing having been Editor-in-Chief of the Philippine Collegian and Chairman of the Editorial Board of the Law Register. For his academic excellence, he was awarded numerous full scholarship grants by various American universities and cited for his scholarly works. An outstanding student and scholar, he has been recognized by his alma mater, the University of the Philippines, as Outstanding Alumnus and honored with **honoris causa** degrees by several educational institutions both here and abroad.

His first appointment in the judiciary was in 1972 as trial judge of Branch II at Quezon City. He was appointed Associate Justice of Court of Appeals in 1980. 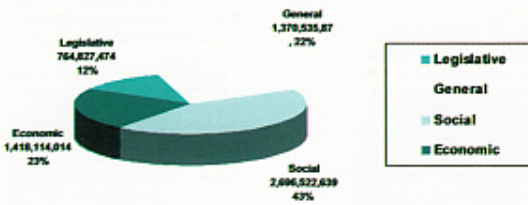

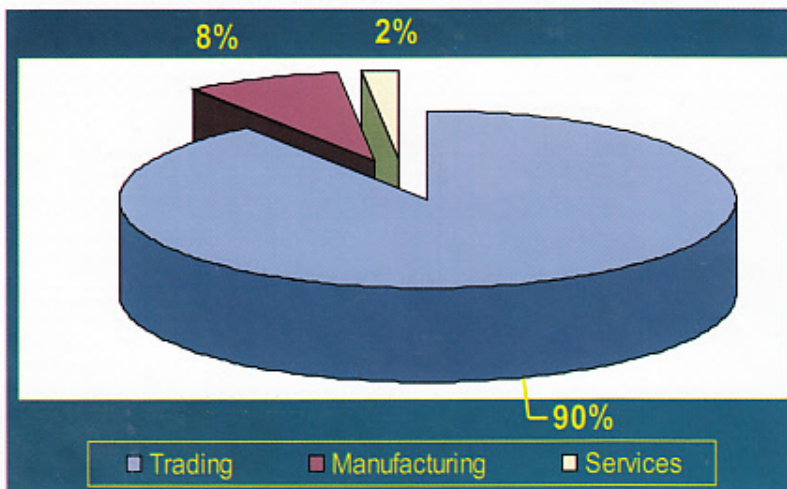
