A RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING THE HONORABLE COUNCILOR ATTY. JESUS MIGUEL SUNTAY FOR HIS ELECTION AND PROCLAMATION AS NATIONAL LEGAL OFFICER FOR THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION OF THE NATIONAL MOVEMENT OF YOUNG LEGISLATORS (NMYL), MARKING A HISTORIC FIRST FOR QUEZON CITY AND THE ORGANIZATION

WHEREAS, the National Movement of Young Legislators (NMYL), founded in 1991, is a national organization of elected local officials aged 40 years old and below, including city and municipal councilors, vice mayors, and board members, committed to the promotion of good governance, ethical leadership, and the principles of "New Politics" founded on principles, platform, and performance;

WHEREAS, the NMYL serves as a vital venue for young local lawmakers to collaborate on legislation, policy development, and capacity building, aimed at strengthening local government units and advancing meaningful nation-building;



WHEREAS, among its key programs and initiatives, the NMYL conducts special executive legal courses, holds national council assemblies, and undertakes regional reorganizations to enhance the legislative competence, professionalism, and effectiveness of its members nationwide;

WHEREAS, the NMYL actively advocates for ethical and performance-driven governance, the localization of national policies and Sustainable Development Goals, and works in close partnership with institutions such as the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) to advance leadership training and good governance initiatives;

WHEREAS, Quezon City has played a significant and historic role in the NMYL since its founding, having been actively involved in its formation and growth under the leadership of then Councilor Francis Kiko Pangilinan, one of the organization's founding leaders;

WHEREAS, Quezon City has consistently distinguished itself in the national organization, having produced four (4) National Presidents of the NMYL, namely: Senator Francis "Kiko" Pangilinan, former Mayor Herbert Bautista, former Councilor Julian Coseteng and Councilor Dorothy Delarmente, underscoring the City's enduring commitment to youth leadership and exemplary public service;

WHEREAS, the NMYL held its 27th National Convention, including the Election and Proclamation of the National Executive Committee, on February 24, 2026, at The Manila Hotel, where young legislators from across the Country convened to reaffirm their commitment to good governance, ethical leadership, and excellence in legislation and policy development;

WHEREAS, during said Election and Proclamation, Honorable Councilor Atty. Jesus Miguel Suntay, a duly elected member of the Quezon City Council, was elected and proclaimed as National Legal Officer for the National Capital Region of the NMYL;

WHEREAS, Councilor Suntay's election is historic, as he is the first individual elected to this position, the same being a newly-created national post, reflecting the trust and confidence reposed in his legal expertise, integrity, and leadership;

WHEREAS, his election further elevates the stature of Quezon City as a consistent incubator of principled, capable, and forward-looking leaders who contribute meaningfully to national leadership and governance.

NOW, THEREFORE,


