*WHEREAS, Quezon City is composed of diverse barangays with  
distinct cultural identities shaped by history, migration, faith traditions,  
creative practices, and community life;*

*WHEREAS, cultural mapping is a participatory process that identifies  
and documents tangible and intangible cultural assets, including heritage  
sites, cultural spaces, artists, cultural workers, religious landmarks,  
traditions, festivals, and community practices;*

*WHEREAS, community-based cultural mapping empowers local  
residents to recognize, value, and safeguard their own cultural heritage,  
while promoting inclusivity, representation, and shared ownership of cultural  
resources;*

WHEREAS, a systematic and barangay-level cultural mapping initiative can support evidence-based planning, cultural education, heritage conservation, tourism development, and creative economy programs of the City;

WHEREAS, barangays, cultural workers, faith-based organizations, schools, senior citizens, youth groups, and community leaders are well-positioned to identify cultural assets within their communities through participatory and consultative processes;

WHEREAS, the Quezon City Government recognizes the importance of inter-agency collaboration in advancing cultural development initiatives that are inclusive, community-driven, and aligned with local priorities.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to encourage, as it does hereby encourage, the implementation of community-based cultural mapping programs in Quezon City.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that barangays be encouraged to undertake participatory cultural mapping activities in coordination with local residents, cultural workers, elders, faith leaders, schools, and community organizations.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Quezon City Tourism Department be encouraged to provide technical guidance and support and to utilize cultural mapping outputs in the development of heritage, cultural tourism, and community-based tourism initiatives.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Quezon City Public Library be encouraged to assist in the consolidation, safekeeping, and public access of cultural mapping outputs, including narratives, photographs, maps, and other community-generated materials, subject to existing policies and guidelines.

RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Department of Education – Schools Division Office, Quezon City be encouraged to support school-based participation in cultural mapping activities as part of learning initiatives that promote local history, culture, and civic engagement.


