

## QC now part of global bid on climate change

QUEZON City is now part of the Resilient Cities Network (R-Cities), a global initiative that supports projects and solutions aimed at building climate resilient urban areas, Mayor Joy Belmonte announced on Thursday.

This development aims to improve the living conditions of over 3.2 million “QCitizens,” she said.

At the same time, Belmonte acknowledged the challenges faced by many local government units (LGUs) in dealing with extreme weather events.

“Quezon City, like many other cities in the Philippines, is vulnerable to extreme heat, tropical cyclones and flooding. Unfortunately, these weather conditions are mostly felt by low-income and vulnerable communities,” she said.
