QC eyes 'sister city' ties with Naga

The Quezon City government is eyeing a “sister city” agreement with Naga to further boost ties and strengthen cooperation between the two local government units.

Former vice president and Naga mayor-elect Leni Robredo visited Mayor Joy Belmonte at the Quezon City hall on Wednesday.

Robredo and Belmonte discussed best practices, particularly in the field of housing and urban development.

They also tackled other programs initiated by the Quezon City government such as the digitization of business and other transactions at city hall, establishment of district action offices, the rollout of the QCitizen ID, development of advanced systems for the public library and health department as well as the city’s online birth registration system.

Robredo, who will be Naga’s first female mayor, expressed gratitude to Belmonte for the warm welcome.

Among the Quezon City officials who joined the meeting were city administrator Mike Alimurung, Housing Community Development and Resettlement Department chief Jojo Conejero and chief of staff Rowena Macatao.

They were also joined by former Quezon City congressman and Robredo’s fellow Liberal Party member Kit Belmonte.
