The Krus na Ligas branch library conducted a simultaneous film showing before grade school pupils from Krus na Ligas Elementary School and General Roxas Elementary School and the San Isidro Galas Branch spearheaded a storytelling session before 40 pupils of Doña Aurora Quezon Elementary School facilitated by Ms. Grace Ann Velez. The story revolves around the Book of Exodus (the Passover) with the main character, the Prince of Egypt, Moses, and the people who have been freed from slavery for over 400 years in the hands of Egyptian Pharaohs.

These activities emphasized the importance of reading the Bible from which students can learn from and adopt in their lives and also an opportune time for them to strengthen their faith and relationship with God. This yearly celebration encourages children to spend their quality time with the Lord by reading His words in the Bible.

Gears Towards an Autism-Friendly Environment

The Quezon City Public Library has partnered with the Autism Society of the Philippines (ASP) for the launch of the first seminar-orientation promoting the development of an autism friendly-environment in the city library.

Councilor Nicole Ella "Nikki" V. Crisologo, who sits as chairperson of the QC Council committee on People with Special Needs and Ms. Cecil Sicam, one of the founders of the ASP, were among those present during the activity.

In her inspirational message, Councilor Crisologo stressed that there is a continuing effort from the Quezon City government to address the concerns of children with special needs in the city. She said that plans are underway to ensure that developmental program shall be adopted by the city for the benefit of children with special needs, specifically those diagnosed with autism.

For her part, Sicam, whose son was diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder, underscored the importance of creating an autism friendly-environment as she encouraged people to be mindful of the challenges faced by people with autism and their families, as well.

Initiated by the Readers Services Division, the orientation-seminar was attended by some 50 library personnel, including division heads, section heads, district coordinators and front liners.

City librarian Emelita L. Villanueva, in her inspirational message, vowed to support the development of an autism-friendly environment at the QCPL as she emphasized that people with autism need more understanding and empathy rather than criticized and belittled.

Held January 20 at the QCPL building, the activity was also attended by ASP Vice President Perlita So.
