Accomplishment Report QCPD 69th Anniversary

It is my honor to submit to the Chief, Philippine National Police the humble and significant administrative as well as operational accomplishments of the Quezon City Police District covering the period from November 2007 to November 2008.

Administrative Accomplishments

IN-SERVICE TRAINING (PROGRAM COURSES)

The QCPD Plans and Training Section in compliance with the DHRDD-Unit Training Program Division (UTPD), NHQ Action Plan CY-2008 has programmed training courses/seminars for CY-2008 for the education and training of the PNP personnel. This is in furtherance to the PNP Transformation Plan complimented by "O.N.E & C.A.R.E Program".

The training program aims to provide all members of the PNP with the essential knowledge and specialized skills necessary in the discharge of their duties efficiently and effectively. It will also help instill discipline, morality and proper work ethics needed for a professional police service.

In the NCRPO Training Directive Number 2008-01, all Districts from NCRPO are given their yearly Training Program for every quarter. This training program is designed to serve as guide in the conduct of in-service training activities required during the year. It focuses on basic knowledge and skills essential to police work as well as those that address contemporary concerns such as: drug problem; kidnap for ransom; and terrorism. Likewise, Police Districts and RSUs are encouraged to initiate other training activities that they may deem necessary.

The objectives of these training programs are:

- a. Provide the PNP personnel relevant education and trainings in order to enhance their professional development. To refresh their knowledge and update their investigative skills on the current techniques and procedure in investigation.
- b. Develop within the PNP personnel acceptable values, skills and knowledge in preparing them for specific jobs/responsibilities necessary in law enforcement to enable them to discharge their duties efficiently and effectively.
- c. Enhance individual proficiency and unit operational readiness to be mentally alert, morally upright and physically fit. The essential factors for law enforcers to serve best the community.

The following are the In-service trainings conducted by this District for the CY 2008:

- ❖ **Human Rights and International Humanitarian Law Seminar (1st to 4th Quarter)** is to teach PNP personnel the role of the PNP in the promotion of Human Rights, its concepts and to provide knowledge on the rules and regulations of International armed conflict.
- ❖ **Police Investigator's Refresher Course (2nd Quarter)** will improve the capabilities and skills of PNP personnel in their respective duties and responsibilities.
- ❖ **IDPA Pistol/Revolver Proficiency Classification Training (1st to 4th Quarter)** for short firearms shall be undertaken by all PNP uniformed personnel to enhance their confidence and proficiency on the use of issued/personal short firearm.

OCPD Annual Report

- ❖ **Basic Shotgun Training Course (1st Quarter to 4th Quarter)** is designed to provide the PNP uniformed personnel the initial training and basic skills in the discharge of their duties responsibilities through the proper handling and maintenance of firearms particularly on shotgun.
- ❖ **Traffic Accident Data Collection Training Course (4th Quarter)** is designed to provide PNP personnel an understanding of the Revised Accident Data Collection of Traffic Accident Data for traffic accidents that have occurred on the Philippine National Road Network.

Our District Director, PSSUPT MAGTANGGOL B GATDULA is much supportive when it comes to enhancing and updating the skills of the QCPD Personnel not only to the Programmed Trainings given by the Higher Headquarters but also to the proposed trainings needed by the different areas of specialty of Offices and Operating Units of the District. 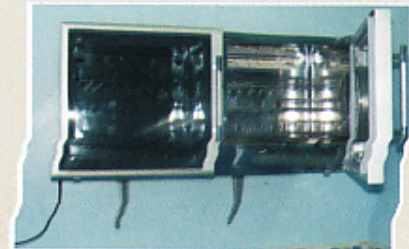

COMPUTER STATISTICS



In line with the police visibility program and the thrust of the former RD, NCRPO PDir Geary L Barias, Quezon City Police District has distinguished itself through the District Intelligence Division (DID) by being one of the first few units in the PNP that seriously utilizes the famed New York City Crime Control Model commonly known as COMPSTAT.

COMPSTAT utilizes computer generated crime statistics that enhance leadership and management capabilities of Police Station Commanders and area commanders in police operations. *It has also guided QCPD Police Station's integrated deployment of available police and community resources.* This strategic program is being thoroughly implemented and conducted on a weekly basis down to the barangays within Quezon City to draw crime statistics and formulate **intelligence driven deployment and employment of forces** and made **Quezon City Police District** the first to blaze the trail in formulating and implementing a concrete strategic framework for peace and order and public safety within its AOR.



The QCPD thru District Intelligence Division also organized a regular meeting with other operating units such as the intelligence offices of PNP, AFP, NICA and other agencies to address all forms of criminality, and to strengthen intelligence network and affiliations with our intelligence counterpart.

The District Intelligence Division (DID) further initiated the conduct of intelligence coordinating conference in QCPD with the different chiefs of ANCAR unit in all adjacent cities and nearby region of Quezon City to strengthen its boundaries which is contributory factor that resulted in the remarkable downtrend of Carnapping incidents within its AOR.



UPGRADING OF WORKPLACE



The Quezon City Police District has developed and nurtured a client-focused service value among its personnel by making its offices client friendly and emphasized to them that their job is more of an opportunity to serve the people to satisfy the demands and expectations of the greatest number of the public.



Among other initiatives, QCPD's records keeping was organized and made into a simulated mini-library where records and periodic reports are systematically stacked in uniform hard-bound covers for accessibility, durability and lasting utility.



Crime Management and Analysis Team (CMAT) was formed and spearheaded by the Chief, DID in order to have a systemic Management of Crimes Statistics. The team is composed of uniformed and non-uniformed personnel who are responsible in preparing intelligence plans, estimates, crime analysis and updates on peace and order which are being presented during the weekly staff conferences, COMPSTAT meetings, executive briefings and other periodic conferences.

CRIME SITUATIONAL MAPS

Deemed easier to have clearer visual of the present crime situation in the AOR, the DID adapted the use of Crime Situational Maps in the office which enables the CMAT team to get an overview of the present crime situation of any given area in the AOR.

Believing in cost efficiency, QCPD devised a way to save money on the Crime Situational Maps being used in their office and made the maps reusable for a very long time by improving the crime plotting system through the use of color-coded magnets instead of colored push pins which further enhanced utility and purpose. The system provided for the DID an all time fresh, undamaged, color coded maps that could endure time and specific demands which is reasonable and highly cost-efficient. Likewise, through the painstaking effort of the CMAT team, the situational maps was laid out into jurisdictions per police stations and were distributed to eleven police stations of the QCPD.



ANTI-CRIMINALITY PROGRAMS



Conducting Anti-Carnapping Tips and Awareness Seminars in different commercial centers to ensure that crimes are prevented and potential victims are forewarned.



Another project of the DID was the ELECTRONIC ROGUE GALLERY SYSTEM which was installed to eleven Police Stations of QCPD.

The District Intelligence Division is in the forefront in the weekly staff briefings reporting an analysis, and forecast of crimes that serve as a basis of the command for Anti-Crime Strategy along with the conduct of monthly COMPSTAT meetings at NCRPO and Executive Briefings every other week at Quezon City Hall.



QCPD is glad to inform of the conceptualization of the **Super Blotter** which was coincidentally launched on the 69th Anniversary of QCPD.

ON COMMUNITY INTELLIGENCE

The District Intelligence Division had religiously conducted covert security and intelligence monitoring including the security coverage during the SONA of Her Excellency Gloria Macapagal Arroyo.

Deployment of Intelligence Operatives to monitor the activities of criminal elements especially during rush hours is maximized.



ON ROBBERY

3 robbers fall in Caloocan



2 suspected robbers slain



Three members of acetylene gang were caught by Masambong Police Station while conducting their heist inside the pawnshop last September 29, 2008

The encounter between the elements of DPIOU-QCPD and 2 robbery hold-up suspects along commonwealth avenue Quezon City.

The neutralization of three (3) robbery hold-up male suspects victimizing gasoline stations and Indian nationals during an encounter with operatives of DPIOU, QCPD on June 19, 2008 along Zabarte Road, Quezon City and the recovery of two cal. 38 (paltik) revolver and the stolen money worth Php21,000.

Neutralization of two (2) Robbery Hold-Up Suspects victimizing FX taxi, public utility vehicle (PUV) and other public conveyances along the stretched of Quezon Ave. by elements of Police Station 2, QCPD on June 14, 2008 at Agham Rd., Quezon City.



The neutralization of six (6) armed male persons during an encounter with the combined elements of DPIOU and SWAT, QCPD that resulted in the injury of five (5) QCPD personnel and the recovery of high powered firearms and hand grenades from the said suspects along Agno St. Brgy Josefa, Quezon City on June 15, 2008.

The solution of two cases of Robbery Hold-Up perpetrated by criminals on board motorcycle wherein the three (3) male suspects were arrested along Sta. Maria St. Holy Spirit, Quezon City on May 22, 2008



The neutralization of one (1) robbery hold-up suspects by Operatives of DPIOU along Luzon Ave. Quezon on May 8, 2008 and the recovery of one (1) 38 cal. Revolver with live ammunitions.

The immediate solution of a robbery incident perpetrated by criminals on board a motorcycle on January 31, 2008 wherein the two (2) suspects were neutralized during an encounter with the elements of CIDU, QCPD along Sgt. Ybardolaza corner Sgt. Rallios, Quezon City. Recovered from the scene were two cal. 38 revolver with live ammunitions, one (1) hand grenade, one (1) Honda Motorcycle color black without plate number and the stolen items

The immediate solution of series of robbery perpetrated by suspect on board a four wheeled motor vehicle specifically a Toyota Corolla color white wherein the suspect was arrested by elements of Police Station 9, QCPD on March 23, 2008

An encounter between the elements of CIDU, QCPD and Robbery hold-up suspects that resulted to the instantaneous death of two (2) male persons and the recovery of two (2) caliber 38 revolver with live ammunitions and the stolen items

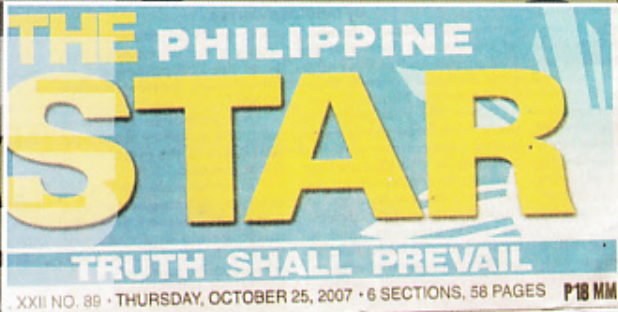

It may be ironic but a Manila resident who couldn't get help from the Manila Police District was aided by agents of a nearby Quezon City Police District in recovering her stolen goods.

QCPD director Senior Supt. Magtanggol B. Gatdula said he was delighted when Evelyn T. Tiansing, of 2115 Santissima Trinidad Street in Sampaloc, Manila personally appeared in his office in Camp Karingal to convey her profound gratitude to six QCPD operatives who showed their dedication to duty in a case of theft last August 11.

Tiansing delivered her hand-penned letter to Gatdula where she narrated what transpired. The letter goes:

Dear Sir,

I am Mrs. Evely Evelyn Tiansing, a resident of 2115 Santissima Trinidad, Sampaloc, Manila.

I would like to call the attention of your good office regarding the immediate and very efficient performance of six policemen— Inspector Alberto Gatus, PO3 Benigno Pancelo, PO3 Edwin A. de la Cruz, PO2 Rommel Apanay, PO2 Nelson Pangan, PO1 Roy Benavidez.

Truly, I appreciate the efforts of these policemen who assisted us all throughout until we were able to retrieve all the items which were stolen thru forced entry in my place early this morning between 2:30 a.m.— 4 a.m., August 11, 2008.

As a resident in Sampaloc, Manila, I sought the attention and assistance of policemen in our precinct but was advised to go to another precinct since it was only the desk officer who was

around and nobody was with him at that moment. So we were forced to proceed to that precinct which he directed us to go, only to find out that the station was "padlocked".

I suddenly thought of seeking help from a nearby precinct, that is at Welcome Rotonda. At first, they were a little bit hesitant since the crime scene was not within their area of responsibility though it just took them seconds to decide most especially when I told them that there was really an urgency for them to respond since we were told that the stolen items were positively identified by a concerned tricycle driver that everything was brought and stored at Bohol Street, still in Sampaloc.

They accompanied us after getting permission from their superior and sought the help of the barangay chairman, we all proceeded to the place (Bohol St.) where I positively identified all the items taken from us which include two full gas stove tanks, one kid's bicycle, two mountain bikes, cooking utensils, curtains and a re-chargeable kid's motorbike which costs P25,000.

If not for the patience and immediate response of these policemen, I would not have retrieved the items. For this reason and out of gratitude, I really and carefully thought of letting them feel how I truly appreciate their "heroism".

May there be more like them in the service!

BEST PRACTICES/IMPACT PROJECTS

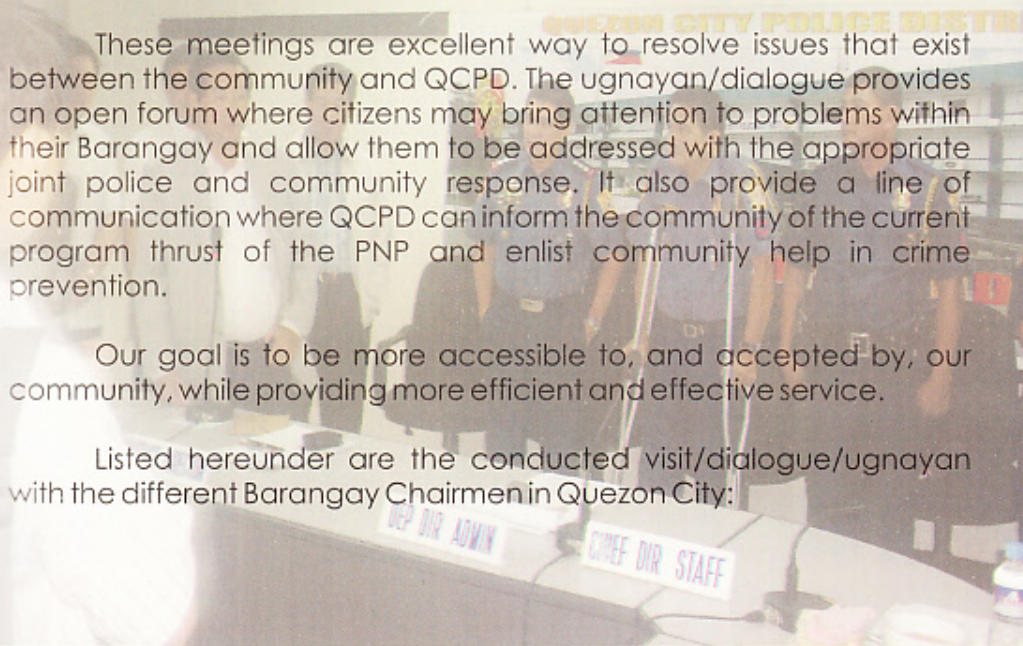

Our goal is to be more accessible to, and accepted by, our community, while providing more efficient and effective service.

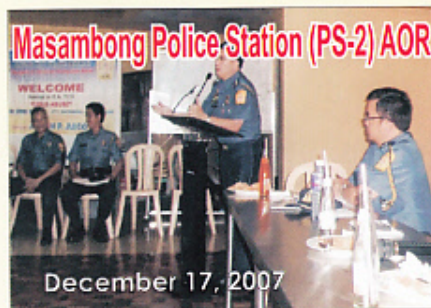

Gender Awareness and Development

The issues of violence against women and children, gender discrimination, the commoditization of women and children, prevalence of crimes committed by young offenders and the indifference from family members and neighbors including the lack of institutional mechanisms to address family violence, have been found as among the many factors of the rising incidence of crimes. One cannot ignore the possibility that violence whether physical, psychological, cultural, economical and emotional also occur in the homes of the uniformed personnel of the PNP or that discrimination between men and women also happens within the ranks of the PNP. The PNP through the DPCRD realized the need to make the PNP the precursor of family violence prevention and a vitalized community-based projects and activities geared towards reducing and eliminating family violence and strengthening relationships within the family, among neighbors and between communities. As a result, on April 12, 2002 under General Orders Number DPL 02-02, the **Family, Juvenile, Gender Awareness and Development Division (FJGADD)** was created under the Directorate for Police Community Relations.



FJGADD, QCPD, has been achieving and implementing the different gender-responsive, women-focused and family and youth oriented activities, programs and projects as set by the Implementing Guidelines on the activation of FJGADD. Reaching out to the family especially the women and children through community, home and school visitations, radio guestings and information dissemination through leaflet distribution and posting of posters concerning the family, women, children and youth. The community and QCPD personnel are made aware of gender equality and sensitivity, the rights of women, children and the youth and the laws protecting them by conducting series of lectures/seminars and dialogues. FJGADD also joins hands with other government agencies like the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD), Social Services Development Department (SSDD) of Quezon City and the QC Gender and Development Resource and Coordinating Office (GADRCO) and NGOs like the Soroptimist Intl, Coalition on Anti-Trafficking in Women-Asia (CATW-AP), SAMARITANA and ECPAT in attaining their goal at reducing the incidence of domestic violence, crimes against women and children and the discrimination of women in the society.

To increase awareness of the citizenry on their role and responsibilities in the maintenance of peace and order, this District through broad, proactive and sustained public information campaign conducted various Community Awareness Activities such as: Bomb Awareness Lectures, Anti-Terrorism Lectures; distribution of anti-kidnapping leaflets and other high profile crime prevention lectures. Likewise, Street Crime lectures were conducted such as, Tips on how to prevent cellphone snatching and anti-carnapping.



Moreover, in order to provide through the mass media a positive climate of public attitude and perception that is conducive to the PNP's effective conduct of police operation; we actively participated in Tri-Media Programs/Activities: radio interviews and TV appearances.

Launching of SB (Sumunod sa Batas) Zone of Discipline

In its commitment to prevent crimes and maintain peace and order, the Quezon City Police District launched the Sumunod sa Batas Zones (SB Zones) on April 23, 2008, a pilot program that established discipline zones, where citizens strictly obey traffic laws and city ordinances.

Citing the presence of "road sores" such as unruly pedestrian, reckless drivers, litterbugs, illegal terminals and even illegal vendors almost occupying road gutters,

different Heads and representative from the DILG, MMDA, EPWMD, DPOS, ABC and QCPD envisions the whole stretch of Commonwealth Avenue from Elliptical Road (Philcoa) to IBP/Litex Road in Quezon City a "zone of discipline" similar to Subic in Pampanga where zero tolerance in the enforcement of laws is strictly observed to instill discipline.

Under the program, every police station will take an aggressive lookout against minor crimes and disorder, imposing zero tolerance to lawlessness. Designated areas, to be known as SB Zones will serve as epicenters of discipline, from where order and discipline shall radiate until it covers all of Quezon City.

The completion of an all out fight against low-level crimes and lawlessness is the declaration of a crime-free community. Upon reaching this stage, another area will be selected to be declared an SB Zone, which will be the next site for thorough fight against initiatory nuisances and crimes in the community level.



The stretch of Commonwealth Avenue from Elliptical Road (Philcoa) to IBP/Litex Road, approximately 6.95 kilometers, will serve as epicenters of discipline. Personnel were deployed to implement the community plans. In the course of its implementation, strategies were adjusted based on a studied assessment and evaluation of the impact of the program in the community.

The second phase of the SB Discipline Zone program which covers Aurora Boulevard in Cubao was launched on August 27, 2008. Under the program, laws and ordinances governing traffic management, environment and sanitation, peace and order, illegal vending, anti-squatting, illegal drugs, vagrancy and other disorderly behavior will be implemented along the 1 ½ kilometer boulevard going to Marikina City and Elliptical Road to Quezon Avenue.
