A RESOLUTION ADOPTING THE REGIONAL NUTRITION COMMITTEE – NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION (RNC-NCR) RESOLUTION NO. 01, SERIES OF 2024, ENJOINING ALL LOCAL GOVERNMENT UNITS IN THE NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION (NCR) TO ADOPT THE UPDATED NATIONAL POLICY ON NUTRITION IN EMERGENCIES

WHEREAS, the Regional Nutrition Committee – National Capital Region (RNC-NCR) through Resolution No. 01, Series of 2024, enjoined all local government units in the National Capital Region to adopt the Updated National Policy on Nutrition in Emergencies (NIE);

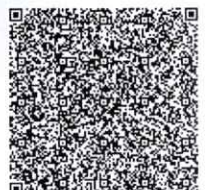
WHEREAS, the Updated National Policy on NIE aims to establish standards and guidelines on appropriate nutrition interventions during emergencies and disasters, identify agency involvement and responsibilities, and provide the basis for nutrition planning, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation;

WHEREAS, the policy is aligned with the current disaster risk reduction and management framework and provides strategic directions for nutrition management in emergencies and disasters, particularly in the areas of planning, nutritional assessment, implementation, monitoring, and evaluation of nutrition interventions during the various phases of emergencies and disasters;

WHEREAS, the policy serves as a guide for health, nutrition, disaster risk reduction and management, and other concerned professionals, volunteers, and stakeholders in coordinating and implementing nutrition management interventions during prevention and mitigation, preparedness, response, recovery, and rehabilitation phases;

WHEREAS, Quezon City recognizes the importance of strengthening local nutrition governance and ensuring the integration of NIE programs into the City's disaster preparedness and response mechanisms in order to protect vulnerable populations, especially infants, children, pregnant women, lactating mothers, senior citizens, and other at-risk sectors during emergencies and disasters.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF QUEZON CITY IN REGULAR SESSION ASSEMBLED, to adopt, as it does hereby adopt, the Regional Nutrition Committee – National Capital Region (RNC-NCR) Resolution No. 01, Series of 2024, enjoining all local government units in the National Capital Region (NCR) to adopt the Updated National Policy on Nutrition in Emergencies as their guide in preparing for and managing food and nutrition situations during emergencies and disasters.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that all Barangays in Quezon City are hereby encouraged to undertake the following actions consistent with the Updated National Policy on Nutrition in Emergencies (NIE):

1. Issue or update local policies organizing their respective Local Nutrition Clusters at the City and barangay levels;
2. Include the Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Officer as a member of the Local Nutrition Cluster;
3. Formulate and integrate the NIE Plan into the Disaster Risk Reduction and Management in Health (DRRM-H) Plan and the Local Nutrition Action Plan (LNAP), with appropriate budgetary allocation;
4. Designate and train an Information Management Officer (IMO);
5. Ensure the availability of adequate logistics, including commodities, assessment tools, information and education materials, communication materials, infrastructure, and other resources necessary for NIE services and interventions; and

6. *Ensure monitoring and timely reporting through the use of appropriate information management tools.*


RESOLVED FURTHERMORE, that the Quezon City Health Department, as Secretariat of the Quezon City Nutrition Committee, be encouraged to coordinate with concerned offices, monitor the implementation of this Resolution, and conduct a review and assessment of the effectiveness of its implementation after three (3) years from its adoption.

RESOLVED FINALLY, that copies of this Resolution be furnished to the National Nutrition Council Central Office, all Barangays in Quezon City, and other concerned offices and agencies for their information, guidance, and appropriate action.
