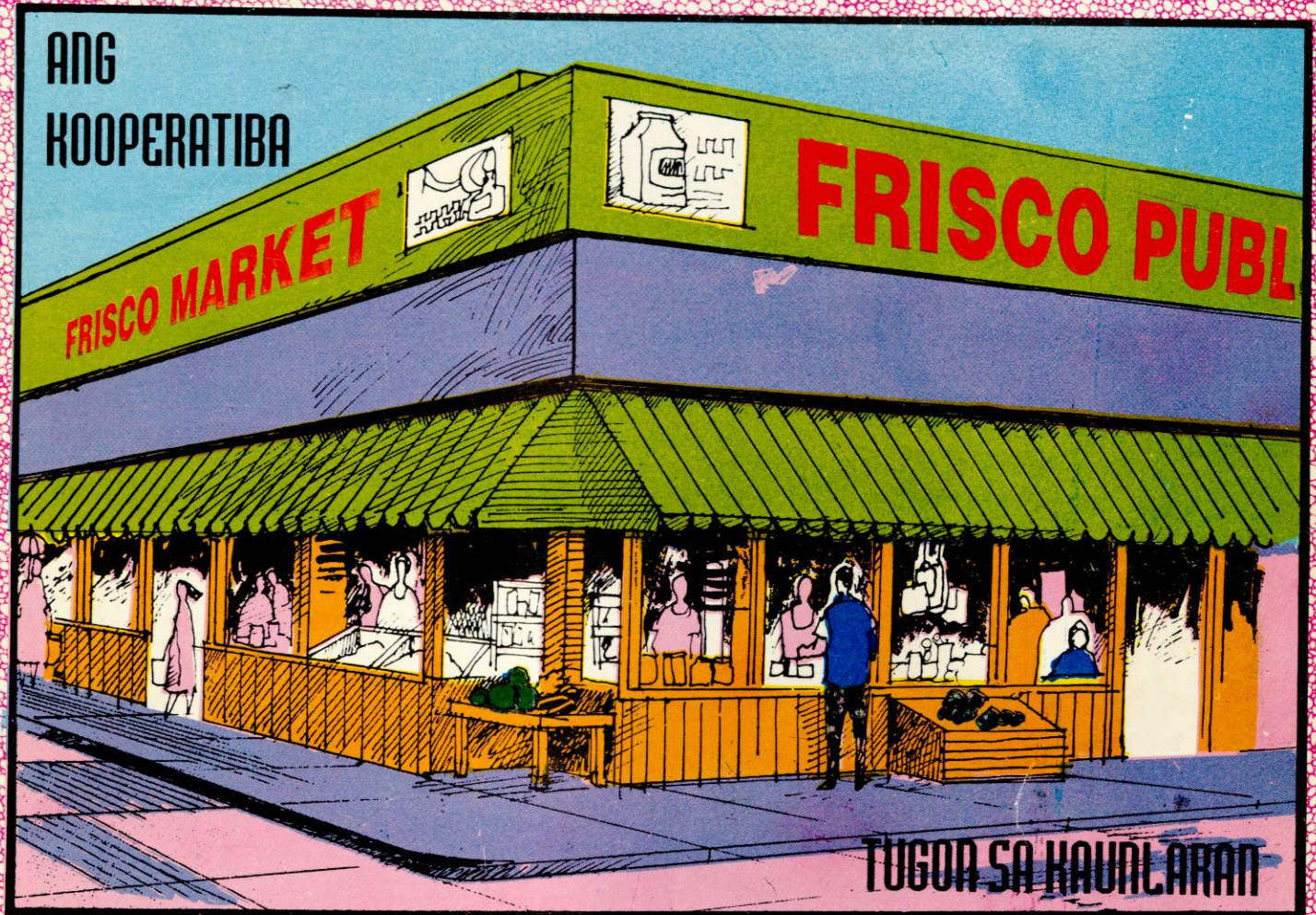



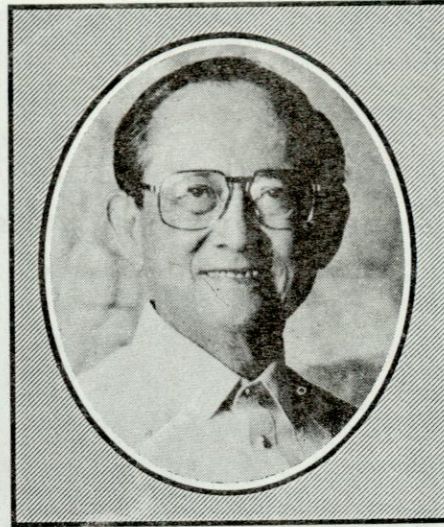
1. copy each of the Certificate of Registration, Article of Cooperation and by-laws duly certified by the Secretary of the Board;

As a cooperative, you could very well play a significant role in addressing the socio-economic needs of the people in your district and in facilitating their empowerment towards improved quality of life.

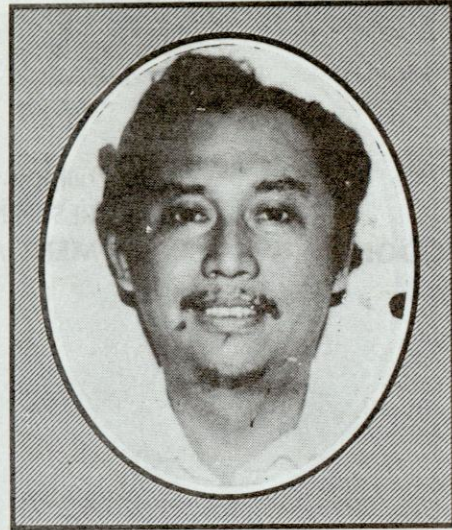
